Dear Friends,

The last eight weeks have been both busy and fruitful. On June 2nd I flew to Arequipa, Peru, actually arriving at 6:00 am on the 3rd. That same afternoon we started the Facilitator Training Course to prepare new facilitators for the Kairos course the following week. I was working along with Colin Bakon, one of the Latin America coordinators for the Simply Mobilizing courses, and Marisol Cahuana to give the two day course.

Then the Kairos course June 5–9 was the first one for Marisol Cahuana as a trainee Head Facilitator. In the first course with a new trainee there is always a little more to do to help them keep the course going smoothly. In the end, 32 people completed the course.

Colin and I flew to Lima, Peru on Monday the 11th. On Tuesday morning we started a two day Head Facilitator training course. There we gave the course with the help of Rosmery Bazán, a Head Facilitator from Trujillo, Peru who recently moved to Lima. The two trainees are now scheduled to run a course in Lima under Rosmery's supervision.

We arrived in Guayaquil, Ecuador on Thursday, June 14. Our next Head Facilitator course ran Saturday and Sunday,



There were 33 participants in the Kairos course including three who traveled from neighboring Chile to be there.

June 16–17. We worked with Daniel Montoya, the first approved Head Facilitator in Ecuador, and six trainees. Their challenge now will be to multiply mobilization courses in western Ecuador.

The Saturday before I flew back to Honduras I received notification that the person I was to supervise for two upcoming courses in San Pedro Sula had withdrawn for personal reasons.

When I arrived on Monday, June 18, I had three days to pull the facilitator training together. We held the course June 22–23 with five new facilitators trained. Then July 2–6 I led a Kairos course where the new facilitators had a chance to serve in their first course, along with other more experienced facilitators.

Coming up, the facilitator training and Kairos course that I was to lead in Tegucigalpa this week have been moved to September. The trip to Spain to help with the Simply Mobilizing courses there is shaping up for the third week in October. I would work in Barcelona, Madrid and Málaga training people to run “The Unfinished Story” course.



During July I taught a three week series on “The Characteristics of a Mobilized Church”.
