



ILIGAN CITY, Philippines (UMNS) — United Methodists are helping some of the thousands displaced by the battle between government forces and Islamic State militants in Marawi City on the island of Mindanao over the past six weeks.

 INCLUDES UNITED METHODISTS**

WITTENBERG, Germany (UMNS) — The United Methodist Church of Germany has organized a booth through July 17 in Wittenberg, Germany. Wittenberg is the city where Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses to the door of a church 500 years ago, setting off the Protestant Reformation.

INMATES LEARN TO GROW FOOD

HARARE, Zimbabwe (UMNS) — Seventeen inmates at a prison in Harare have learned to grow food through a program organized by The United Methodist Church and the Zimbabwe Prison and Correctional Service, graduating with certificates in horticulture.

**WOMEN ARE MAJORITY IN GENERAL
 AGENCY WORKFORCE**

CHICAGO — A desk audit of The United Methodist Church's general agencies, conducted by the Commission on the Status and Role of Women, showed that women comprise two-thirds of the general agency workforce. Fifty

percent of those in the top position of general secretary are women, compared to 31 percent in a 2007 audit.

**PLEDGES FOR PEACE
 IN KOREAN PENINSULA**

LEIPZIG, Germany (WCC) — As part of the closing worship service for a forum on peace in the Korean Peninsula, a pastor from North Korea and a pastor from South Korea presided over Holy Communion together, while United Methodist Bishop Hee-Soo Jung of Wisconsin preached. "We're connected to God, to Jesus, to each other," he said. "Our lives are connected — whether we like it or not." Faith representatives outlined an advocacy plan during the meeting, which was hosted by the World Communion of Reformed Churches and the World Council of Churches.

**RACIAL-JUSTICE GRANT PROGRAM
 GETS STARTED**

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Racial-justice projects initiated and led by young people will receive financial support with funds allocated by the Connectional Table, Discipleship Ministries and two other United Methodist general agencies. Grants up to \$2,500 will be available, starting in September.

**COMMENTARY: BISHOP WARD
 ON HISPANIC MINISTRIES**

GARNER, N.C. — The North Carolina Conference's Bishop Hope Morgan Ward and her cabinet are learning Spanish and planning an immersion trip to Guatemala. "Hispanic ministries are an important part of our life in mission together," Ward writes, adding that this year marks the 25th anniversary of the denomination's National Plan for Hispanic/Latino Ministry.
