A Note From Pastor Samuel

Family of St. Mark's,

This December, I was asked to write a devotional for a United Methodist church in the village of Gouverneur, in upper New York, the birthplace of the Lifesaver candy. Before joining St. Mark's, my dear friend, who pastors in that village, invited me to spend a few days with him and to participate in Holy Communion together, something we had not done in many years. A few

weeks ago, I got an email saying that they needed spots filled for their parishioner-run devotional for Advent, and I could not help but answer the call to help a fellow church. What started as one devotional for Christmas Eve became two, and I have shared them below:

December 5th, 2025: Matthew 1: 18-24: Despite its significance, the story of Joseph gets lost in the majesty of the divine conception of Mary. If we're being honest, who can blame us? We choose the Son of God and angels versus a silent, sleeping character. However, as we look at the text, Joseph is called righteous and is willing to endure social criticism to preserve Mary's reputation (Matt. 1: 19-20).

In this moment, this is where the story becomes interesting: Joseph has decided to do more than what the social order would have required him, but he receives a vision of a different, more beautiful path to remain beside Mary and see Jesus for himself. Is it the easier path? Not at all. Will it be a journey of ridicule, confusion, and probably telling the same story to dozens of people that aren't really listening anyway? More than likely. But Joseph is not concerned with the status quo; he is invested in showing the world who Jesus is.

Take this week to listen to what God may be telling you to do in your own life. In reflection, prayer, and conversation, the ideas that the Holy Spirit places into your heart may not be as strange as they seem at first, and may lead you directly to seeing Jesus and the Kingdom of Heaven here on earth.

December 24th, 2025: James 5: 7-10: This is it, friends. The day before the arrival of the Christ Child, when everything will be made right in the world, right? Unfortunately for us, our world has a way of not being so clean and pristine during the holidays. Being a minister for

almost a decade, I have experienced both births and deaths on Christmas Eve, plans that had been shattered, and others that had been seen through. The truth of the matter is that we do not know what tomorrow looks like, but we do have the promise of God's faithfulness that we will endure.

In James' letter, he writes to a persecuted group of Christians under internal and external pressure. In

the climactic ending, James cites the Prophets of the Old Testament as examples of steadfastness in difficult times (Jas. 5:10b). Almost 750 years earlier, God's truth and examples continued to be shown through societal uncertainty. The importance of the Prophets in this example is that God had used a wide range of people to speak His word, and He continues to use many that the world rejects, ignores, or attempts to silence.

This is the good news from James: we have gifts to offer everyone we meet this holiday season, including ourselves! Whether we are feeling overwhelmed, overworked, or underappreciated, God's gift to the world reminds us that we do not know every aspect of someone's life, but we can choose to be kind, caring, and patient to one another. Sometimes, simply our presence is the greatest present we can offer someone.

As the last newsletter of the year, I pray that your hearts are full of joy, peace, love, and wonder as we enter 2026. St. Mark's is here because of you and your love of God and His people!
