Family of St. Mark's,

With the Season of Epiphany, the time of imagining, of dreaming, and of revealing where the Christchild is in your life, it is time for a new season: Lent. No, not the stuff you find in your pockets, but deriving from the Old English word, "lencten," meaning, "spring season." Out of all of the seasons of the church, it may be my actual favorite, and let me give you a few reasons why:

The Tradition Is Ancient: As it should be believed, Easter was celebrated much earlier than Christmas, with references to the resurrection dating back to the early 2nd century. The first Easter homily we have on record is from Melito of Sardis during the 150s AD! It was not until the Council of Nicea in 325 that the official date for Easter was solidified, along with a Lenten fast to prepare for Easter.

Fasting is Integral to Discipleship: Whether it is the Mosaic laws, the fasting of Daniel, Elijah, Esther, Moses, King David, Jesus, Paul the Apostle, alongside many others, the Bible shows that willingly resisting temptation for the sake of devotion to God is evident. In some of the earliest church writings, such as the *Didache*, early Christians fasted multiple times a week to remove distractions and temptations and to live a more holy life. In our modern world, particularly in the West, we can struggle with the concept of removing pleasures. After all, one of the most profitable medical sectors, if not the most lucrative, is pain relief. Living in a consumeristic world makes us believe that anything we can want should be ours, when the Gospel reminds us to take care of our neighbors as we would take care of ourselves. In reducing the grip that the world has on us, the better and more responsive we can be to what God is calling us to do in our daily lives.

Its History is Redemption: Throughout Christian history, the season of Lent has been a time to prepare new disciples and to reconcile with those who have fallen astray. This is partly the history of Ash Wednesday, when believers who were unable to participate in the church community would willingly wear a cross of ash on their foreheads to symbolize their desire to atone and repent. Over the forty-day season, they would receive encouragement and support from their congregations, and, Lord willing, receive Holy Communion again on Easter Sunday.

I understand that this factoid isn't Biblical on its own, but it speaks to the redemptive and uplifting nature of Christ and of the church we are called to be. If you decide to celebrate Lent in a new way with a new fast, or perhaps take a new action in your daily life, don't be discouraged. We are all here to support you on this journey!
