October is a very special time for the church, and I would like to share with you what is happening and why!

October 5th: World Communion Sunday: A new-ish church holiday started in 1933 by the Presbyterian Church to both lift the importance of the sacrament and to remind Christians of our shared story through The Last

Supper. This service looks similar to our normal services, but with an emphasis on Communion, involving special liturgy and singing.

October 19th: Laity Sunday: A Special Sunday for the United Methodist Church, it is a celebration of the people of the church, sometimes referred to as laity, and all the things we do for our community! The word, "laity," comes from the Greek word, "λαϊκός," (laikos) meaning, "of the people."

October 26th: Reformation Sunday: You've definitely heard of Martin Luther before, but where did the revolutionary during the Civil Rights Movement get his name? From a German lawyer to a changer of the course of history, Martin Luther radicalized the church in 1517 and began the Protestant Reformation. Want to learn more? Come and join us, and like Pentecost, we join with our Lutheran siblings and wear red!

October 26th: The Blessing of the Animals, 3:30 PM: October is known as Francis of Assisi Month, an Italian monk who founded the Franciscan Order based on his vow to poverty, his generosity towards others, and his love for all of God's creatures, big and small. To commemorate this, we have started an annual tradition of bringing our furry, scaly, and winged friends together for a blessing before FROGS and Tadpoles!

Aside from these extraordinary events, other notable occasions occur in October, including Pastor Appreciation Month, as well as Nikki and I's anniversary. This year we celebrate 10 years together, we cannot thank St Mark's enough for their warmth, love, and hospitality they have shared for a third of our marriage together.

I look over our member's list often and pray for each of you. My spiritual journey has had my heart overflowing with joy and courage walking beside the people of St. Mark's, and I look forward to another blessed Adventide together (when the time comes!)




UWF READING PROGRAM

For decades, Indigenous women and girls have gone missing or been found murdered along an isolated stretch of highway in northwestern British Columbia.

Highway of Tears, and it has come to symbolize a national crisis. In this book, journalist Jessica McDiarmid meticulously investigates the devastating effect these tragedies have had on the families of the victims and their communities, and how systemic racism and indifference have created a climate in which Indigenous women and girls are overpoliced yet


