

Easter AT THE BALLPARK

FLUOR FIELD F.A.Q.



Q: DO I NEED A TICKET?

A: No. Easter at The Ballpark is free and open to all in the community. Seating will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. The upper deck suites will not be used.

Q: WILL FLUOR FIELD'S CLEAR-BAG POLICY BE IN EFFECT?

A: YES!! Large purses, diaper bags and backpacks will not be permitted. Fans may carry a small clutch bag, or purse, no larger than 6.5" x 4.5", with or without a strap. For specifics on this policy, please visit the [MILB website](#).

Q: WHAT TIME SHOULD I GET THERE?

A: The service will start at 10:30am. Please give yourself time to park, get to the stadium and clear security. The entry gate on Field Street will open at 9:30am.

Q: WHERE SHOULD I PARK?

A: The same places you park near the stadium when attending Greenville Drive games. Parking lots will be available off Field Street. Brushy Creek's bus will be shuttling guests from County Square. Handicap and 60+ year-old-parking will be available in the C.D. Joyner lot on Field Street.

Q: HOW DO I GET TO FLUOR FIELD?

A: Here are [directions to the ballpark](#), the home field of the Greenville Drive, located in Downtown Greenville.

Q: WHAT GATE SHOULD I ENTER?

A: The only gate that will be open for entrance is the gate across from the Shoeless Joe Jackson Museum on Field Street. Please note, this gate is on the first base side of the park. The main gate near the children's playground, on the third base side of the park, will be closed.

Q: WHAT SHOULD I WEAR?

A: Whatever you'd usually wear to the ballpark, or Easter services. You'll see a little bit of everything. Brushy Creek members, you can wear your usual Easter dress, or if you'd like to wear your green Brushy Creek shirt, that will help guests identify members in the event they have a question about our church. If you do not have a green shirt, visit Member Services on Sunday mornings prior to April 21, to pick one up.

Q: HOW LONG WILL THE SERVICE RUN?

A: We plan to wrap up the service prior to noon.

Q: WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

A: A fun morning with inspirational music, a time of prayer, and a moving message that will focus on Jesus Christ. Live music will be presented by the Brushy Creek Worship Team and soloists. Dr. Jeremy Roberts will be delivering the sermon.

Q: WILL I HAVE TO DO OR SAY ANYTHING?

A: No pressure will be placed on anyone to do or say anything. We welcome all to come to this first-ever, community-wide Easter service at Fluor Field. Should you want to join in singing and prayer from your seat, that is up to you. If you want to speak to anyone about Jesus, what He means to us, and what He can mean to you, a private area will be set up to visit one-on-one with a Brushy Creek pastor or deacon.

Q: WILL THE PLAYGROUND BE OPEN FOR CHILDREN?

A: Yes. The Playground will be open for children to play, however, they will not be under the care of church staff, nor volunteers. Parents will be responsible for their children at all times.

Q: WILL THERE BE FOOD?

A: No. Concessions will not be open.

Q: WHAT IF I WANT TO KNOW MORE ABOUT BRUSHY CREEK?

A: We will have pastors and volunteers at the Ballpark who will be easily identifiable stationed near the entrance gate, and walking around.
