

WEEK 2 LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS:

SHARE: In what ways have we been discipled by the world to separate our spirituality and our sexuality? What difference does it make to see our sexuality a part of a divine design rather than mere biology?

SHARE: Pastor Ken shared a quote from Sam Allberry that said, "Being a Christian means that I believe what I believe about sexuality because I believe what I believe about Jesus. I follow Him, which means I follow what He teaches about

this part of my life." What are your thoughts about this quote? What does this mean for people who don't yet know Jesus?

READ: MATTHEW 9:3-6. What does this verse tell you about God's design for sexuality? Why is it important to understand the idea of oneness in marriage? How do you think real oneness is achieved in marriage?

READ: EXODUS 20:14 and MATTHEW 5:27-28. Understanding God's design for sexuality, why is adultery forbidden?

READ: 1 CORINTHIANS 6:9-11. And 1 TIMOTHY 1:10-11. How many sins are listed? Why do we tend to elevate one sin, like homosexuality above other sins? Why is it important for us not to rank sins?

READ: MARK 7:20-23. Where does sexual immorality start? What do we miss when we focus only on the behavior and not the heart? What kinds of things are our hearts chasing after when we commit sexual sin? How does Jesus offer a better way to fulfill those things?

READ: MATTHEW 19:10-12. Why do you think people have a hard time seeing celibacy as an option? How have we made it hard for single people to see their celibacy as a gift or opportunity? How could the church better minister to single people?

READ: 1 CORINTHINANS 7:1-9. What phrase in this passage stands out to you? What causes us to have a consumer attitude when it comes to sexuality? What is one thing new you have learned about God's design for sexuality?
