Games and Activities

Fishing game

Cut out several fish shapes from colored paper or card and add a paperclip to each one. Next, tie a magnet to a piece of string, and attach the other end of the string to a stick or pencil. Finally, create a "fishing pond" by laying out a large sheet or blanket on the floor and scattering the fish shapes across it.

You could also add additional challenges or questions to the fish, such as asking children to name a time when they had to ask for forgiveness or how they can show love and forgiveness to others.



"Feed My Lambs" game

Set up two bowls and some breakfast cereal (or other small, lightweight items that can be easily scooped with a spoon). Print or draw a picture of a lamb and tape it to one of the bowls to create the "lamb bowl."

To play the game, give each child a spoon, and explain that their goal is to move all the cereal from the "feeding bowl" to the "lamb bowl" using only their spoon.

When you say "go," the children can begin scooping up cereal with their spoons and carrying it over to the "lamb." without dropping it.



Breakfast Bible Time

Introducing a breakfast Bible time with your children can be a wonderful way to start the day. Even if it's just once a week, making it a special occasion will strengthen your family's faith. You could also consider organizing a special breakfast at church for this lesson, where families can gather together, just as Jesus and Peter did on the beach.
