


November brings change. In the midst of it, we celebrate All Saints and Thanksgiving.



The custom of commemorating all the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the 3rd century. All Saints Day celebrates baptized people of God, living and dead, who make up the body of Christ. Many congregations remember the faithful who've died within the past year.

We are the saints who are the living body of Christ, the Church. Praise the Lord! O praise the name of the Lord!

All Saints Day, November 2nd, we'll name those who died from New Hope since last All Saints, as well as those who were buried through our ministry. All are invited to light a candle in memory of loved ones during the service.

As we move through our years, we are aware of the more difficult days we face when loved ones die. The grief Mary and Martha felt as they stood at their brother Lazarus' tomb, is our grief. We live in the shadow of death at every instant. We know the heartache of life in the midst of illness, heartbreak, and burdens seeming too much to bear.

On *All Saints* we remember most that God, in Jesus Christ, sent the Light who is constant. Jesus spoke the last word at the tomb of Lazarus, saying: "*Unbind him, and let him go*" (John 11:44). He speaks the same word to us. In our baptism God brought us through the waters, through death, to new life. In the bread and wine we receive forgiveness, life, and salvation. We need not fear. God is good, and we rest in his hands both now, and forever. Claim the peace offered through faith in Jesus Christ.

"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing...

Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise.

Give thanks to him, bless his name." -Psalm 100

Thanksgiving Eve worship is Wednesday, November 26th, 7p at our Sand Creek site. Hear Stories of Thanks during the service, and enjoy traditional desserts with fellowship afterward. You may sign up on the church office door to bring desserts. We gather to share gratitude. The Psalmist, in the closing verses of Psalm 100 declares:

DEVOTIONAL: More Than a Moment

I think I could fill pages with "thanks". There is one incident that happened a short time ago that brings great thankfulness from me to God. A late night thunderstorm, a terrific "boom" and one lightning strike very close to the front of our house. A bit closer and all would've been gone. But, with God's protection, it only took out our phone service. Times like this certainly makes you thank God and praise his name.

We should love and thank God often, not just when something special happens. The pastor once said to the children, "when you wake up each morning, say 'I love you, Jesus', and give thanks. That's a lesson for all of us. On our worst days, there is something to thank God for.

Dear friends and partners in ministry,

Greetings from Guyana, where I serve to help the ELCG (Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana) strengthen its leadership development so congregations and ministries may flourish. On leadership development, the church echoes efforts of the Guyana government itself, elected last month. In my previous newsletters, I asked you to join prayers to those of the church here for a peaceful election. During the campaign, there was anxiety that scenes of violence after the election 5 years ago might repeat this time. Therefore, the church seriously urged to pray "for all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life" (1 Tim. 2: 1-2). September 1st, the previous government was peacefully re-elected for another 5-year term.

Guyana has a parliamentary government system, now led by the People's Progressive Party/Civic (PPP/C), with President, Mohamed Irfaan Ali. This government is overseeing what is currently the fastest-growing economy in the world (37%), as a result of significant oil production begun in 2019. Some ways the oil revenue was spent seem likely to have a positive effect not only on the country as a whole but also on the Lutheran church in particular.

For years, the ELCG suffered impact of migration, as many members and leaders moved to countries with higher standards of living. Congregations shrunk and so has number of clergy. The Lutheran Lay Academy I help coordinate aims to build a larger leadership base for the church, at the same time the government is taking measures to build a larger base of educated leaders for the country. One of its initiatives, begun in January, is to cover the cost of education for every student accepted at the University of Guyana in any program. After graduation, these students must remain in Guyana and repay the country for their free education by working 3-5 years in salaried positions with the Ministry of Public Service in the field they studied. After that, they may work anywhere.

Several of our students in the Lutheran Lay Academy benefit from this government initiative. Veronica Sawh-Crandon and Marika Grimmond, completing studies in nursing now work in the hospital. Nathan Balak completed studies in communication and was just given a position in the Office of the Prime Minister. Adiola Bruce is currently studying science. With upturn in economic prospects, some church members who've migrated are returning to Guyana; positive momentum. A good sign is the revival of the Lutheran Men's Ministry of the church, which was dormant for some time.

With thanksgiving for all of these things, I share with you part of a prayer for the government, from the ELCG's Service Book/Hymnal. Pray it with us, for this country and yours. "Good Lord, preserve our nation in justice and honor and continue your blessings to us as a people that we may live together with integrity. Grant health and wisdom to all who bear office in our land... Help them to strive for justice and peace according to your holy will."


