Advent: Season of Hope

O Day of Peace, will be our Call to Worship this Advent season. The text is written by Carl P. Daw Jr. b. 1944. The tune is Jerusalem, by Hubert H. Parry, 1848-1918.

> O day of peace that dimly shines through all our hopes and prayers and dreams, Guide us to justice, truth, and love, delivered from our selfish schemes. May swords of hate fall from our hands, Our hearts from envy find release, Till by God's grace our warring world Shall see Christ's promised reign of peace.

Then shall the wolf dwell with the lamb, *Nor shall the fierce devour the small;* As beasts and cattle calmly graze, a little child shall lead them all. Then enemies shall learn to love. all creatures find their true accord; The hope of peace shall be fulfilled, for all the earth shall know the Lord.

In November we come to the end of our liturgical church year with Christ the King Sunday. We enter the season of Thanksgiving, and the new liturgical church year begins with the First Sunday in Advent. It is a season of thanks; a season where hope is brought to the fore. Advent prepares us to receive the Babe of Bethlehem, the Promised One. The sanctuary is adorned with the liturgical color of Advent blue, and glimpses of the coming Christmas celebration begin to appear.

We do dream of peace, that often shines dimly. Though our prayers are unceasing, the world rages on. We walk on in hopes of justice, truth, and love, but find it difficult even to bring the same from our own cold hearts. Swords of hate, whether with literal weapons, or more often the weapon of our tongue, are a constant. While we dream of light, even our own hearts are often darkened.

What a beautiful biblical image of the lion, or wolf, dwelling with the lamb. One hopes that no longer will the fierce devour the small. Peaceful pastures - a symphony of serenity - may it abound. God let it be so.

A little child shall lead them; lead us. In the beginning, and the end, it is all about Jesus. Many today would put Jesus aside. But only in Jesus is there true peace, justice, truth, and love. Therein lies the center. Jesus only.

Let us hold fast the confession our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful." (Hebrews 10:23) "Hold fast that which is good." (1st Thessalonians 5:21) "Hold fast what you have, so that no one may seize your crown." (Revelation 3:11) -Pastor Michael Sparby

Approaching the Christmas season so many of us adore, I'd like to address a few churchy words theologians like to use and sound impressive when using them. The first word is incarnation and the second is Emmanuel.

You will again hear the passage from the first chapter of John on Christmas Day. The passage famously concludes in verse 14 with, "And the Word became flesh and lived among us..." This verse speaks directly to the concept of incarnation. In other words, it speaks to a God who literally takes on human flesh and enters this world in the form of baby Jesus. It's in stark contrast to what some believe and experience - a God who exists far away, only to look down on us from God's heavenly throne. Instead, the incarnate God speaks to a God who is willing to take on the human experience with all the joys and sorrows that come with it. One can readily see Jesus did indeed make his way through the human experience. He felt joy. He felt pain. His eyes teared up. And even if I can't recall a story when he laughed, I gotta believe he really did!

Another passage found in the Christmas season comes from the gospel of Matthew, which references Isaiah 7:14: "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means, 'God is with us.'" One of the most important lessons I ever learned in seminary was in a pastoral care class. I hoped to learn what to say, especially to someone hurting or grieving. What I learned was much more important. Instead of learning what to say, I was taught to show up; be present. As time passes, few will remember what I say, but will remember I was there. That's precisely why the name Emmanuel means so much to me. It's a constant reminder God is always with us. Consider the final words in the gospel of Matthew: "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20b) Presence matters because God embodies it and teaches it.

Christmas is known for its gift giving nature. We share gifts with one another to reveal our love for them. This year, I hope that regardless of the quantity or quality of the wrapped presents that lay under the tree, you will recognize the gift of presence. Not only the presence of your loved ones, but particularly the presence of God. So many of you will grieve as you experience the lack of presence from a loved one due to death or distance. My heart grieves with you. My hope lies in a God who provides and will gift you all with someone who will be present with you in some way at some time. If nothing else, remember God's presence as you receive the body and blood of Christ in the worship services you attend, for that's yet another way in which God shows up.

Fellow disciples, Merry Christmas to you all and may the presence of God incarnate, Emmanuel, embrace you in such a way that brings warmth to your heart! -Bishop Martin


