Dear friends and partners in ministry,

Christ is risen! He is risen, indeed. In Guyana, where I'm assisting the Evangelical Lutheran Church (ELCG) to strengthen its leadership development program, people have a beautiful way of celebrating Christ's resurrection. Easter day, children do not hunt for eggs or chocolate bunnies; instead, they fly kites with their families. This year, it was pouring rain all morning, but by mid-afternoon, the sun came out and so had the children and their kites.



The message of God's victory over sin and death

came at a time when it needed to be heard in Guyana for all the seven weeks of the Easter season, while the country went through a tragedy that affected everyone, including the Lutheran church. April 24th, an 11 year-old girl, Adrianna Younge was found dead in the swimming pool of a hotel, where her family spent the previous day. Since the hotel owner and the police mishandled the initial investigation of what happened, controversy began to swirl, resulting in international pathologists asked to do the autopsy so that their finding would be accepted as impartial. However, when their finding was that Adrianna drowned with no violence involved, the family refused to accept it, and protests took place all over the country as people accused police and government of covering up a crime. Some protesters looted shops and burned tires/branches across the highway, causing much of the country to shut down for a few days.

The date for Adrianna's funeral was May 5th, in the middle of the annual Lutheran church convention schedule. Fearing much unrest on that day, the Executive Council of the ELCG postponed the convention to May 25-27th. Adrianna's family also postponed the funeral to an undetermined date so they could send her body to the U.S. for a second autopsy. Investigation of the case proceeds, just as the country prepares for September national elections. Many Guyanese are praying the campaign season doesn't turn violent because of the turbulence of Adrianna Younge's death.

I'm told in the last elections, tensions between Afro-Guyanese and Indo-Guyanese broke out into open conflict that threatened to invade the ELCG, which is proud to be an ethnically mixed church in which people of every heritage live, work, and worship together peacefully. Pr. Amanda Singh addressed the violence with the congregations in her care, saying, "Not in this church! We are one in the Lord." Please pray with all of us here in Guyana for peaceful elections and the ELCG can continue to model a respectful, loving multiethnic community.

The church's convention was held smoothly at the end of May. The new date corresponded with Guyana's Independence Day, May 26th, so as I drove to and from the convention site, I passed rows of national flags hanging from utility poles along the highway. As I crossed the Berbice River Bridge, I saw another colorful sight. For the first time in my life, I witnessed a full rainbow, end-to-end, emerging from the middle of the river.

At the convention's opening worship service, a beautiful young dancer named Zoraya, a member of Redeemer Lutheran Church in Georgetown, illustrated through her movements the power of Jesus' name, which means "The Lord saves." That is indeed the message of Easter, that the Lord saves us from sin, death, and all evil powers that would drive us to violence, despair, hatred and bitterness. That is what Pr. Amanda told congregations in her care, and it is what all of us need to hear, not only in Guyana, but also where you live. I pray it may comfort you and let you soar with confidence throughout the year.
