Dear Friends + Partners in Ministry,

“Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!” And we rise in him from whatever dark places hold us. That is God’s promise. Holy Saturday, I heard two students of the Lutheran Lay Academy of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Guyana (ELCG) preach this promise during a memorial service for the life of the late Rev. Leroy Nicholson. Since my primary responsibility here in Guyana is to strengthen the ELCG’s Lay Academy in order to prepare more people for leadership in the congregations, their fine, faithful leadership made me thank God that the work bears fruit!

I celebrated Easter with two congregations of the ELCG: St. Luke, in the small town of Philippi; and St. James, in the equally small town of Whim. Both congregations are part of St. Michael parish, where the parish council is led by Marika Grimmond, former Lutheran Lay Academy student, and now a nurse. She’s pictured greeting St. Luke congregation following Easter worship.

Since there are presently not enough leaders to minister to all the congregations in all 13 of the church’s parishes, I’ve recently been responsible for preaching and administering the Lord’s Supper in four parishes, rotating between them 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays/monthly. I’m in St. Michael parish the 1st Sunday, traveling to St. Barnabas, St. Luke, and St. James congregations, one after the other. I’m in St. Matthew and Ascension parishes the 3rd Sunday, where I start at Holy Communion congregation (St. Matthew parish) and then alternate between King of Glory and Ascension congregations (Ascension parish). On a 5th Sunday, I’m at St. John parish, which contains three congregations of St. Peter, St. Bartholomew, and St. John. (see map of all the Guyana Lutheran congregations in 1969. Highlighted are the ones I visit as supply preacher.)

I’m introducing a few congregations I visit as supply preacher. Last time I was at Holy Communion Church was Lent. Holy Communion is in the village of Victoria, a suburb of the capital city, Georgetown. The village was established just after the emancipation of the enslaved Africans in 1838, when a community of formerly enslaved people pooled their hard-won resources and bought the land in order to start their own small businesses. It must’ve taken enormous courage and industry.

Every other month on the 3rd Sunday, I rush out of Holy Communion after worship to make it (always late!) to King of Glory, 50 minutes away. I’m thankful for a new highway to avoid driving through Georgetown to get to the new high-span bridge over the Demerara River that takes me to West Coast Demerara, to King of Glory. There are times when no adults attend service, but three committed teens always clean the church and set up worship, just in case. If there are no adults, we have Sunday School. Pictured are Emily, Ashton, and Ethan, on the day we studied Jesus teaching his disciples to serve one another instead of competing with one another for glory. I told them cleaning the church, as they do, is a good example of such service.

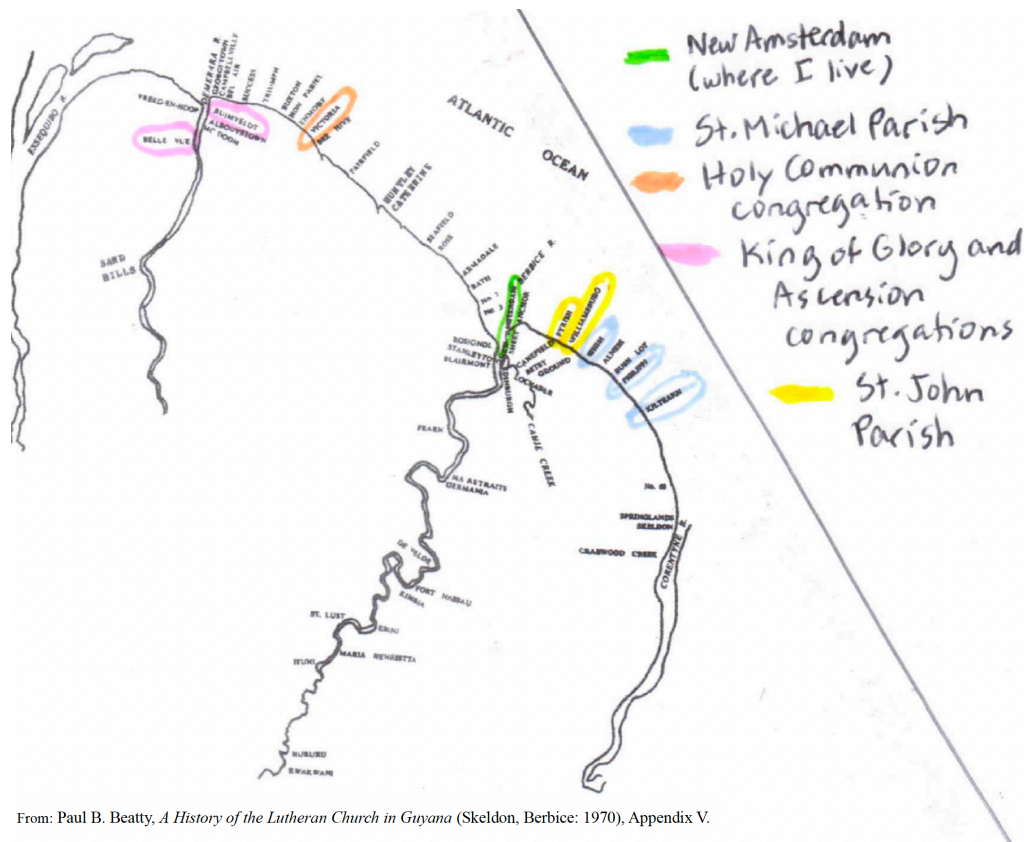
