Construction Project Update

The recent construction activity in the education wing includes new classroom doors hung, door locks installed, existing electrical outlets corrected, new cabinets, drawers and shelves installed, new countertops and sinks installed, hallway and classroom lighting updated, and new flooring in the hallways and classrooms laid. We are in the midst of county inspections and resolving punch list items. It is still expected that we will get an occupancy permit and turnover from the general contractor in early December.
