## A Message from Pastor Sharon Core October 2025

"Puzzling"

I love jigsaw puzzles. Here is my most recent completion.

My longtime strategy has been to find all the

straight edge pieces and fit together the border. I sift through the box – straight edges in one pile and everything else in another. And then as I begin to put the border together I realize I've missed some straight edges and have huge gaps in the border. At this point I can either sift through all the pieces again or stay with what I have and trust they will turn up as I work on other parts of the puzzle. Usually I stay with what I have.

Recently, I have tried another strategy-as I take pieces out of the box, I pay very close attention to the picture of the puzzle and begin grouping pieces



by color and design. All the straight edges and others go in the same pile and then from there I begin putting the puzzle together based on whatever part of the puzzle I'm most drawn to.

The donut puzzle was a combination of the two—some straight edges put together and then all the rest grouped according to color/design. I started with the purple ones (because purple is my favorite color—although I don't think I'd ever eat a purple donut—truth be told, I don't think I'd eat any of them, but I digress!).

In the "little over a month" that I have been in your midst, I'm figuring out the pieces that make up the puzzle of Redeemer. I've been having lots of conversations, asking lots of questions, and doing a fair amount of reading. I'm working on understanding how everything fits together. And by everything, I mean everything—from worship to social outreach to ham runs to Tuesday morning faith group to confirmation to young adults to food donations to construction to ushers to chancel care to social justice and equity to (add yours here). Each part of your ministry has a distinct shape and purpose. And each is part of the larger whole held together by the border of being disciples of Jesus Christ.

As we continue on this transitional journey together, we'll be looking at all the pieces and I imagine we will discover some that have fallen on the floor or are hidden in the couch cushions. This looking will be an opportunity to remember where you've been and where you would like to go. What pieces is God calling you to include in the Redeemer puzzle? How might the pieces be rearranged? All exciting questions and possibilities.

#### **Construction Project Updates from September**

Good news! The County has approved our site plan and granted our waiver request for a modification to the requirements for stormwater management. The modification allows for an underground pipe to be installed to hold water on site from a storm and then slowly release it. This is instead of having to build a more involved and expensive stormwater facility. We are still waiting for County approval on the construction documents for the Columbarium and the Natural Play Area. We still hope to break ground for the next phase, which is the exterior work, late this fall.

Ceiling tiles are now being removed in the old classroom wing so that new pipes and electrical wires can be installed for the new HVAC system. The old boiler has been taken offline and those pipes and wall radiators are being removed too. Also, the new rooftop HVAC control units will be put into place soon. There will be one on each side of the building and each room will now be able to control its own temperature, a function not available with the old boiler system.

You may notice that additional ceiling tiles have been removed in areas adjacent to the education wing. This needed to happen in order to more efficiently complete the work on the new HVAC system. Completing it in a more expeditious way will help improve the timeline for bringing the new heating system online sooner, given that cooler weather is around the corner.

Later in the fall when we break ground for the Columbarium, additional information will be distributed on how to reserve and purchase a niche. Individual niches will be able to hold one or two urns containing ashes. The internal size of a niche is 11.5" x 11.5" x 11.5". Therefore, when selecting an urn for a loved one, please note these dimensions and what size urn or urns will fit into the space. The outside of the niche will have a granite cover plate with one or two engraved names and dates.

## Minutes: September 8, 2025, Meeting of Congregation Council RLC Library and via Zoom

Call to order. Karen Miller called the meeting to order at 7:34

<u>Opening Devotions.</u> Pastor Core led opening devotions with prayer and a reading of Luke 13:10-17. Pastor Core used the story to reflect upon the value of being curious about other perspectives when experiencing new things.

**Approval of Minutes.** Minutes from the meeting were previously approved by email.

Adoption of Agenda. The agenda, as emailed in advance of the meeting, was approved by the Council.

<u>Executive Committee Summary.</u> The Executive Committee met on September 5 and talked about the items on tonight's agenda.

<u>General Updates from Pastor Core.</u> Interim Pastor Sharon Core shared that since her arrival in mid-August she has had several meetings and conversations with members and staff to learn about the Congregation, its ministries, and its routines. She reiterated that her door is open for even more conversations and opportunities to learn.

<u>Treasurer's Report.</u> Treasurer Steve Bott presented the 2025 Financial Summary through August 31, which was made available via email prior to the meeting. Expenses exceed receipts by \$35,000. The shortfall is less than reported in July, which is a trend in the right direction.

<u>Approval Item: Endowment Committee Motion.</u> On behalf of the Endowment Committee, Gene Morrow made the motion that Redeemer contribute \$4,000 as its quarterly gift to Comfort Cases, an organization which provides packed duffel bags and backpacks to foster children as they relocate to new foster homes.

The motion was seconded by Lena Martikainen. The motion was approved unanimously by Council.

<u>Discussion Item: Stewardship Committee Update.</u> On behalf of the Stewardship Committee, Tyler Posey asked Council for guidance on using Temple Talk as a possible venue for ministries and individuals to promote awareness and participation in their activities. Council expressed support and encouraged the Stewardship Committee to coordinate a schedule of recurring Temple Talks so that congregants can hear about the concrete ways in which Redeemer's ministries and individuals build faith, help others, and support the Church's operations.

<u>Discussion Items: Updates from Redeemer.</u> President Karen Miller provided Council with the following updates:

- Rooftop HVAC Work has been completed.
- The interior construction project is underway. Work in the classroom hallway is scheduled to be completed in December 2025, at which time work on the office hallway will begin.
- Tyler Posey drafted, and Karen Miller reviewed and sent a letter to Pastor John Teitman in appreciation of his leading Worship between PSK's retirement and Pastor Core's arrival.

<u>Approval Item: County Signature Authority.</u> To satisfy Fairfax County requirements for construction permits and mortgage loan closing, Karen Miller presented the following statement for approval by Council:

The Congregation Council of the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer hereby affirms that Karen Cavallo Miller as President of the Council and Sabine Detweiler as Vice President of the Council are designated to sign on behalf of the congregation for the Fairfax County building permit documentation requirements and the mortgage loan closing documentation.

Tyler Posey made the motion to approve the statement as presented. Gene Morrow seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously by Council.

<u>Discussion Item: Pastor Core Schedule and Time Off.</u> Due to family needs, Pastor Sharon asked for time off for one weekend in October and a more extended time in the early winter, yet to be determined. Council approved both requests.

<u>Discussion Item: The Call Committee Process.</u> Council discussed the feasibility and value of establishing a Transition Team, as described in "Healthy Transitions: From Rostered Minister Vacancy to Installation," a handbook distributed by the Metropolitan Washington DC Synod to assist congregations in their transition between pastors. Among other benefits, a Transition Team could serve as liaison between the Congregation and the Interim Minister, assemble the Ministry Site Profile, and meet with congregation and council members in preparation of forming the Call Committee, which is a requirement in Redeemer's constitution.

After discussion, Pastor Core offered to present at the next Council's meeting guidelines on how a Transition Team, composed of 3-5 individuals, can navigate the call process. Council members were invited to prayerfully consider members to serve on a Transition Team. Karen Miller offered to draft a brief status update to appear in the green sheet before the end of the month.

<u>Discussion Item: Council Membership Review.</u> The council members listed below will complete their first term in early 2026 and are up for reelection at the annual meeting:

- Megan Kratz
- Gene Morrow

They have been asked to notify Karen Miller if they do not intend to continue serving on Council to give adequate time to create a nominating committee to identify new candidates.

<u>Discussion Item: Annual Meeting Date Selection.</u> Council agreed on holding the Annual Meeting on February 22, 2026, in light of constitutional requirements and availability of Council members.

<u>Ministry Reports: Faith Formation.</u> Annabelle Allard confirmed that Fatih Formation began on September 7 as scheduled and that all classes had coverage for the first session.



## **Quilting Group**

We hope you enjoyed seeing all of our creative quilts in April and May when they were blessed. As you can see, we've been busy! Obviously, we love our mission.

The Quilting Group meets on the first and third Wednesdays of each month from 9:00-11:30 am in Fellowship Hall. We are a small group of five ladies on a mission to share our love of sewing. We continue to support Partner for Surgery in Guatemala along with Project Linus (which we started supporting in 2024). Our quilts are various sizes based upon Project Linus guidelines: minimum sizes: 36" x 36" for baby blankets, 42" x 60" for children's blankets, and 45" x 72" for teen blankets, in addition to fleece blankets.

Project Linus supports local Fairfax County organizations such as Ronald McDonald House, Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS), kids who have lost a military service parent, local emergency situations and national emergency situations when a call for assistance is received, and INOVA Hospital, to name a few.

Partner for Surgery, Guatemala provides medical and surgical care in rural Guatemala, helping impoverished Guatemalan children and families living in remote locations. Our quilts are hand delivered by Frank Petersen. Additionally, we provide handmade tote bags and bears for the children.

Additionally, this year, we "teamed" up with the Prayer Shawl Group to make fleece blankets for Project Linus. The Quilting Group purchased the fleece, rotary skip blade and prepped the fleece for the crocheters to put an edge on. Additionally, any leftover fleece from the blankets was made into scarves to support the Prayer Shawl's scarf drive later this year. The Quilting Group will deliver both quilts and blankets made by Prayer Shawl to the Project Linus drop off location.

Our group is always looking for assistance, and we welcome new sewers into our small group. If you are unable to attend in person, we can provide you with supplies to design a quilt or even a bundled set (quilt top, batting, backing fabric, and yarn) to make at your leisure at home. Other ways to help include monetary donations; fabric, thread, and other sewing/quilting items are welcome. When donating money, please designate it for the "Quilting Group." Monetary donations will go toward the purchase of much-needed batting, fabric, thread, and any other supplies as needed.
