Have you ever heard something – and instantly been convicted by the Holy Spirit? Happened to me this morning on the way to work, the DJ was asking, “Do you go home at the end of the day and feel like ‘What did I accomplish today?’ Maybe feeling unfulfilled, thinking ‘am I doing life right?’”

She came across these verses:

(Galatians 5:22-23)

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

She went on to ask, “Are we even considering this as we go about our day? Are we eating these fruits?

Sharing them? Planting them?”

I have a sign in my office that says, “Throw kindness around like confetti!”

What would our hours, days, years, or lives look like if we intentionally threw around the Fruit of the Spirit to make everyone’s day better?

Against such there is no law means that the Fruit of the Spirit corresponds perfectly with God’s law. The law was meant to limit, restrain, deter, or prohibit certain behaviors and wrongheadedness; however, no prohibition is needed against these virtues.

There is no law against loving others or experiencing and spreading joy. God wants us to cultivate and to grow strong in sharing this Spirit-produced fruit.

THE BOILER ROOM OF THE CHURCH

The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective” (James 5:16).

The name might not sound familiar, but his bearded profile remains — to this day — highly identifiable. That's right, Charles Haddon Spurgeon, considered the “Prince of Preachers,” also sported one of the most distinguished “Baptist beards” in history.

Facial features aside, it was his preaching that drew massive and diverse crowds in 19th-century London. Spurgeon wasn't just a powerful voice in the pulpit — he was a prolific author, a faithful pastor, and a man deeply shaped by prayer. I've never studied much of his life in depth, but there's one story about him that has always stayed with me.

One day, while showing visiting pastors around his church, Spurgeon surprised them by leading them away from the sanctuary — and down into the basement. As they headed downstairs, he dropped a clue as to their destination — he wanted to show them his “boiler room.” (After living in North Dakota for three years, I can appreciate the importance of a boiler room — although it's not the first place you show visitors — unless they're freezing!)

Spurgeon led them to a room filled with people praying and as he opened the door, he simply said: “Gentlemen, this is the boiler room of the church.” In other words, this is where the real power comes from — not the stage, not the sermons, not the crowd, but **THROUGH** prayer. That image is as convicting as it is clarifying.

In Spurgeon's time, steam power was the energy behind everything — and this prayer-filled room was the real “powerhouse” or “boiler room” of the church. Spurgeon said with a smile to his guests, “This is our boiler room. And the secret to our success as a church is ... my people pray for me.” Yes, even pastors need someone to pray for them as they devote their lives to helping others.

And prayer is the powerhouse that helps all of us! The true strength of the church has never been its programs, its personalities, or its platforms — it has always been its prayer and its unity. When the church is united in prayer, God moves throughout the church and its community. When unity breaks down, the power wanes and fades.

And yet, how easily we lose sight of that.

We can become divided over the smallest things — watery Country Time lemonade, weak coffee, the temperature in the room, the music volume, a seat that feels “claimed,” or a comment that felt overlooked. Small irritations can even become big offenses, and before we know it, we're more passionate about preferences than prayer, more focused on comfort than Christ, and more concerned with our experience than our mission. The enemy doesn't need to destroy the church if he can distract it.

He just needs to keep us offended, divided, and focused on things that don't matter eternally.

Spurgeon's boiler room reminds us what the church is supposed to be built on: not complaints, but intercession; not division, but unity; not preferences, but prayer. Because spiritual power flows where hearts are united and where knees are bent.

May we be a church that knows where its power truly comes from — not the pulpit, not the programs, not the polished areas — but instead, in the prayer room (the “boiler room”). And may we protect unity as fiercely as we pursue prayer, remembering that what truly sustains the church isn't what happens in the sanctuary, but it's what happens in the boiler room.

And maybe it's time for me to grow a full beard. It seems to work for hockey — sometimes.
