



# From the Pastor's Desk

It is unbelievable that we are already halfway through November of 2025 and entering the holiday season! People are busy planning for Thanksgiving gatherings and celebrations surrounding the birth of our Lord; meanwhile, I'm scratching my head and wondering where this year went. Where did the time go? How did we arrive here so quickly? All my life I've heard people say that "time flies" and apparently, they were correct! I used to laugh at my grandparents and then at my parents as they told me "Time goes by faster as you get older." What nonsense! Time always moves at the same speed.

But when we're young, we think this lifetime will last forever. Then we have those shocking moments of awakening when we recognize our own mortality, we recognize the brevity of life and realize that we have no guarantees regarding time. Time goes by quickly and even if we are blessed with longevity, as we approach the end, we'll see all our failures and the things we've left unspoken, undone, and unfulfilled. We all need to practice making the most of our time. Paul instructed the Ephesians they needed to be "making the most of your time" (5:16a). Have you ever considered . . .

Where does time come from? God is the Creator of all things, including time. In Genesis 1 we read that He "separated the light from the darkness" . . . "There was evening and there was morning, one day" (1:4-5). Solomon (with his divine wisdom) reminds us that "There is an appointed time for everything. And there is a time for every event under heaven" (Eccl. 3:1). God created time and given it to us as a gift. We are to steward that gift and use it as a blessing to the One who has given it. This is why Jesus stated in John 9:4 that "We must work the works of Him who sent Me as long as it is day; night is coming when no one can work." Since Jesus calls us to use time wisely, we should all be asking . . .

How should I use my time? This is the question in the stewardship of time! Thoreau wrote, "You cannot kill time without injuring eternity." Americans have more time-saving devices than any other people in history but complain that "We don't have time!" Truthfully, most of us need to use our time more wisely! But how? Establish priorities in your life. Determine an acceptable pace for your life. Concentrate on what matters and shut out distractions and then, Dedicate your time to the Lord for His purposes. You may still be asking, but . . .

Why should we use our time wisely? As believers we must remember that using time wisely keeps us "eternity focused." This will change how we view and use time. We will want to use what we have to bless others and bring glory to God as we serve to grow His kingdom. We will find time to share Jesus with others and praise Him as He changes hearts, lives, and eternal destinies.

Today, I want you to think about "TIME." Time is flying by and life is passing quickly. Paul told the Corinthians, "Behold, now is 'THE ACCEPTABLE TIME,' behold, now is 'THE DAY OF SALVATION'" (2 Cor. 6:2). Would you take advantage of this time and come to Jesus? Cry out to Him in repentance and faith. Surrender to Him, follow Him, and you will . . . Be Blessed!
