

From the Pastor's Desk

Most of us are familiar with the account of Jesus and His friends attending a wedding in Cana. Jesus was not a “wedding crasher,” they’d been invited! We know this wedding provided the setting for Jesus to perform the 1st miracle of His public ministry although He did so reluctantly and with some protest. John begins chapter 2 telling us that **“On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee”** (2:1), so this is the culmination of week 1 of His ministry.

The scene shift from Judea along the Jordan River to Cana of Galilee, about 60 miles north. Jesus’ group walked all that way to attend a wedding taking place in Cana. We’re not told who was getting married, but it might have been a family member of Jesus, due to Mary’s presence, involvement, and prominence at the wedding feast. I love this story because it reveals . . .

...The presence of Jesus in the everyday moments (John 2:1-3). Jesus is with us in the everyday moments if He’s invited. Jesus and His friends made a long journey, on foot to attend this wedding in Cana. Who knew that the groom would run short on wine, which was considered a disaster and an embarrassment. When a crisis arises in life, it’s nice to have Jesus close by! Mary made a point of telling Jesus about this need. *Have you ever been in one of those moments!* Suddenly, something is needed and you have no answers; all you can do is cry out to the Lord for help! I’ve been there before and it’s amazing in those moments to see . . .

...How Jesus fills the void in our lives (2:4-8). Mary told Jesus the problem and instructed the servants to do whatever He told them to do. She took her problem to Jesus and left it there! It seems He may have grumbled a little (typical son!), but He acted upon her request. What is required for a miracle to occur? There must be a **need** (no wine), an **assessment** of what is available (waterpots and water), **directions** from the Master (7b-8), and **obedience** to the Master! We may not always understand what God is doing, but I would challenge you to see, understand, and believe in . . .

...The excellence of what Jesus does (2:9-12). When the servants took the wine to the headwaiter, he had no idea he was tasting a miracle, but the faithful servants knew (imagine how hard it was to keep a straight face and not laugh out loud!) We aren’t told how it happened – there’s no record of a prayer or words – we’re simply told that **“the water which had become wine.”** Friends, it wasn’t **JUST WINE!** It was the best wine served at this feast. John calls this miracle a **“sign.”** Do you know the purpose of a sign? It is to give directions or point the way, so people can find their way and not get lost! Jesus was beginning to reveal Himself to the world.

This account allows us to see Jesus’ power to transform something normal (water) into something special (like the best wine)! “How do you see yourself?” Most people say “I’m just an ordinary person. I’m just average!” Jesus can transform you into something new, special, and different today. He transformed me and He’s ready to do the same for you today. Will you hear His voice and act in obedience? Let Him touch you and you will . . . Be Blessed!

Promises

March has been described as a month of promise. The promise of winter concluding and Spring beginning. If you live in the south March is a time of warming temperatures, blooming daffodils, great crappie fishing and the return of butterflies. With the spring time change you have more evening daylight to enjoy these great things and the words of Psalm 96:11-12 seem to come alive.

Speaking of promises, I don’t know about where you grew up but in south Arkansas, we had something called a “pinkie swear”. You would lock your last digit together with someone and then make a promise about something very important. Like, not telling that you had your first crush or that you cried when you watched “Old Yeller”. Import stuff like that. Your pinkie swear was your promise to never tell anyone else the secret of another person.

As I grew a little older, I began to understand that not all people kept their promises pinkie swear or not. If it benefited them to tell your secret on many occasions they would. A word called trust was limited to a few friends and family that had proved themselves loyal.

As I grew older still, I began to realize that only God kept every promise. Mom is sitting at about 99 percent but there was that one time that we won’t talk about right now.

As much as we would like to think of ourselves as totally trustworthy, we are not 100 percent. Sometimes we have told a secret with the intent of hurting others but more often it simply “slipped out”, those words were said before we could even think.

*For All flesh is as grass, And all the glory
of man as the flower of grass.*
