The winding of the labyrinth helps us to “unwind”, to let go and rest in God. It offers a spiritual space for prayer and reflection providing a stilling space in a busy world. A labyrinth is different from a maze. A maze is full of dead ends and designed to get you lost. A labyrinth has only one path that always leads to the center...if you stay on the path you cannot get lost!

YOUR labyrinth prayer time can be as open or as focused as you would like it to be. You might want to simply enter the labyrinth and be with the Lord or you might like to take time to:

- \*Read and reflect on a line or two from Scripture
- \*Hold a memory or a photo of a loved one you want to remember or pray for
- \*Consider an experience in your life where you are seeking healing or forgiveness and talk to God while in the center of the labyrinth.
- \*Think about a key celebration in your life and walk a prayer of thanksgiving.
