

I often have the privilege of sitting with people in difficult life experiences. Things like a cancer diagnosis, the death of a child or spouse, or news that a loved one died by suicide. Other times people are heartbroken because of political realities that threaten the rights of immigrants, women or LGBTQIA+ people. As people process these painful realities, sometimes I hear questions like, "Why did God let this happen?" or statements like "God must have a plan."

Behind these statements is an assumption that if something happens in our lives, then God willed it. The problem with this is that when bad things happen, we tend to look for someone to blame. We end up blaming God or ourselves or even other people.

This is normal, because the theology we have been taught and even the worldview our culture has given us makes these assumptions. However, I wonder if there is a different way to process and make sense of life and God's role in it.

I'll always remember when my theology about this started shifting. I was on a flight trying to ignore the other passengers around me by reading a book. However, my book was a theology book and the person sitting next to me was a religion professor, so he was interested in the topic and started asking me questions.

I was in my late twenties and he was about my age. We started talking about theology and his religion classes and soon, he was sharing with me that his wife had received a terminal cancer diagnosis. He was struggling. He didn't understand why this was happening to her at such a young age. He was grieving the life they dreamed of but would not have and he was grieving changes in his marriage because of her illness

As we talked, he said he was struggling to believe in a God who would do this or even allow this to happen. He had always been taught that God is all-powerful, all-knowing, all loving, and good. And if he imagined a human scenario in which there was an all-powerful, all-knowing, all loving and good parent with their child and there was a person with a gun in the same room. And the person with the gun pointed it at the child and pulled the trigger, he believed that the parent (if they had the powers we ascribe to God) would reach in and catch the bullet so that it did not strike the child.

This was the first time that it dawned on me that when we refuse to compromise on God's power, what we end up compromising is God's love and goodness. Perhaps God is not as powerful as we have been taught. Perhaps it's not that God won't or that God doesn't.

Maybe it's that God can't.

These are the kinds of questions we are going to grapple with together during worship in September. Join us on Sundays at 9:00 or 10:15 am.
