On Tuesday, 10/13/2020, the **Safe Reopening Task force** reviewed the data regarding new cases in Sedgwick County and available hospital beds. The 14 day rolling average of new COVID cases in our county has been slowly increasing during the previous two week period. In addition, the Sedgwick County COVID dashboard continues to classify our hospital status as moderate, and it indicates there are fewer beds available at the end of this review period. Per the Task Force's review, we will continue in Phase 2 of our plan for reopening the building. The next assessment is on 10/25/2020.
