

Disaster Relief

Texas District LCMS

Central Texas Flooding on July 4th

We pray God's peace and healing upon the victims of the disastrous flooding that occurred over the 4th of July weekend. Here is how you or your congregation can support Texas District flood relief efforts:

- Track ongoing updates. Follow the Texas District Facebook page for the most timely updates.
- Donate online to relief efforts. The Texas District is not taking material donations or organizing volunteer teams, so monetary donations are the most effective way to help. 100% of designated donations go to relief efforts. You may also donate by check, made out to "Texas District LCMS" with "Disaster Relief" in the memo line and mailed to 1221 Satellite View, Round Rock, TX 78665.
- Donated funds are directed in two main ways:

 Assistance for Texas District Church Workers We provide direct support to church workers (pastors, teachers, staff) who the floods have personally impacted. This assistance helps with essential needs, including temporary housing, basic living expenses, and home repairs.
- Support for Texas District Congregations Funds help our congregations that have suffered damage to their facilities or equipment. This may include covering costs for cleanup, repairs, or replacement of essential items to ensure the church can remain open and continue its ministry.
- As funds become available, assistance is provided to members of LCMS congregations to help them recover from the flooding.

Generosity: A Single Lane Roadway or a Multi-Lane Highway?

Usually when we think of "Generosity," we tend to view it from a financial perspective. However, in reality, "Generosity" comes from a much wider perspective.

Every day, every gift, which the Lord provides us, is given to us so that we may give it away. That is "Generosity," indeed! We give away our time, talent, and resources because the Lord has given us these gifts to share with others.

What are some of the ways that we can express our "Generosity?"

First, if someone is rude or unkind to you, do not respond in a similar fashion. Maybe the person did not realize that he or she had offended you or the person may be under a great deal of stress due to some personal matter. Quietly, ask the Lord to bless the person and move on.

Also, be aware of your own thoughts, actions, or expressions. Think before you speak or act. Once you have said it or done it, you cannot retrieve it. One approach if you are upset about something is to get out a writing tablet or open your computer and express your miserable thoughts. After expressing them, you then can delete them, but you got it "off your chest" and no relationship with another person has been disrupted.

Second, you can go the extra mile to assist a person or a group of persons to lighten their burdens. Their burdens may be physical or mental, but by counseling them you may help them to overcome their burdens. Just talking something out with another person can relieve many stressful situations. Ultimately, you can raise the spirits of the person or persons. Of course, one measure is to pray with them.

Third, be generous to yourself by taking care of your body. Eat healthy, exercise, and thank God for the health you can continue to have rather than focusing on how your body used to be. In the case of exercise, it is not necessary to be able to press several pounds of iron or to run a marathon. Simply walking around is deemed to be good exercise for the maintenance of good health.

Fourth, grow spiritually. Spend more time in prayer and less time on social media and television. Find a quiet place and listen to the Lord. Seek to bring more laughter, joy and forgiveness to those around you.

These are just a few of the ways that you can express your generosity other than through financial means. Bless the Lord for the gift of "Generosity!" Get on the many lanes of that major highway! Your soul will appreciate it and you will be happier for it.


