- -Each student should be able to name three adults who care about their faith life as a part of Trinity

### Where do students get faith?

Faith is passed on! Parents are more effective than pastors, youth directors, and congregation members, when it comes to passing on values and faith. One cannot be taught faith; it must be experienced.

God calls parents to pass on their faith.

Our confirmation program operates with the understanding that we as leaders are not the primary people passing on the faith to the upcoming generations, parents and families are! We believe that Trinity is called by God to give parents and families the resources, support and encouragement to do this. We are here to help you!

Our confirmation curriculum includes expectations that connect to significant aspects of being a follower of Jesus. These include:

- 1. Worship establish a pattern to worship God in your life
- 2. Service through serving we make God's love visible and learn to put others first
- 3. Class/Learning drawing on wisdom of other Christians we ask big questions and exercise our spiritual muscles
- 4. Fellowship we have the joy, support, and care of fellow believers

### 1. Worship

10 Sermon notes- which can be completed in two ways – paper form or online form at <a href="http://betrinity.com/education/confirmation">http://betrinity.com/education/confirmation</a> and use any of our worship service offerings. If sermon notes are not your thing, participation in leading worship (reading, skits, children sermon, singing, assisting with online worship or running technology beyond what is expected) could also meet this requirement. Note 10 is less than the required number for previous years as we realize there are additional stressors on families during this time.

Each student will have a sermon note folder for hard copy sermon notes. They will also be able to complete sermon notes online if they so choose.

Acolyte and Tech Leadership- *In addition* to 10 sermon notes students are expected to **sign up each fall and spring for slots to be acolytes** (light the candles, assist with communion baskets, be an example for those participating in worship) **or tech team** (assist with camera and projectors). Each student will be trained for these tasks and are asked to be at service 15 minutes before worship to acolyte and 30 minutes prior if assisting with tech. This is part of your worship experience as a confirmation student.

### 2. Service

Students will be asked to do two service projects and complete a service project form for each or have a conversation with their pastor or mentor about what they did. This is something that could also be completed with their mentor. Service project opportunities will be announced throughout the year. The form for service projects can be filled out online or in paper form. The <u>online</u> forms on the same page as sermon note forms.

### 3. Class/Learning

Complete one option for each sessions, choosing one of the following options:

Option 1: Participating in a group class session (we plan for these to be in-person, weather/covid permitting).

Option 2: Have a conversation with your mentor reading the *Manna and Mercy* Book and answering questions provided for that particular lesson.

If choosing Option 2, to ensure each student is working with the material of each lesson we ask that mentors report the lesson was completed using a google form found at this direct link: <u>Confirmation Remote Learning Form or at http://betrinity.com/education/confirmation</u>

Lenten services are at 7:00p.m. when having Soup Suppers. Wednesday Lenten services are considered class sessions and confirmation students will assist in serving Soup Suppers.

### 4. Fellowship

There will be opportunities for fellowship with one another. These may be events planned by Trinity or opportunities that you may do with your mentor. There is an expectation that you will spend time with your faith family of Trinity in different ways.

The expectation is for the above portions to be completed during the 2023-2024 school year prior to May 1st, 2024. For those completing their second year (8th graders for 2023-2024), the Rite of Affirmation of Baptism is Sunday, October 13th, 2024.

### **Mentors**

Each student is asked to have an adult mentor – a Trinity Adult with a vibrant faith life, who *is not* the student's parent or guardian or a parent or guardian of another current confirmation student. This is someone the confirmation student is comfortable speaking with and spending time. This will be an important aspect to this year as there is a possibility that not all learning may happen in a classroom/lecture type setting.

What is expected of a mentor?

Mentors are asked to do the following:

- -Get to know your student joys, struggles, hobbies, their family, their birthday etc. Reach out to them outside of confirmation class and let them know you care about them and how their year is going
- -Assist your student in their learning: by attending group class sessions when possible, be willing to have conversations with them, and/or check in on their progress on class coursework.
- -Pray for your student!

We ask that these actions be done with the knowledge of the parents of the students and in ways that uphold the values and policies of Trinity Lutheran Church.

- Appropriate mentor relationships include:
  - Keeping one-on-one time with students public and with parental consent
  - Being aware of appropriate language, sharing, and behavior (you are a role model to your student!) Please see guidance from our protection policy.

Please ensure that Trinity knows you are a confirmation mentor and has correct contact information for you to keep you up to date with information especially in such an unpredictable year! Form to submit information can be found here: Mentor Information Form

Parent, Mentors and Students,

In addition to the Confirmation Covenant, it is also understood through your participation that you are aware of our Child Protection Policy and agree to uphold its guidance.

- -This includes good practices such as appropriate sharing, language, behavior, keeping conversation public and with parental consent, reporting any inappropriate action in order for it to be addressed, and keeping confirmation a safe time and space. More specifics are found in our protection policy and Pastor Jeanette, confirmation leaders and staff can answer any questions.
  - -Your participation also is an agreement to uphold the policies of Trinity Lutheran Church, including the Trinity covenant of conduct (in the back of our hymnal) and Covid guidance.

- · We do this by: Not putting others' thoughts or ideas down.
- · No name calling, no using hurtful, offensive, or destructive language
- · Respecting people's property

### We believe in respecting those in authority.

· We do this by: Respecting the leaders, pastor and mentors

### We believe in participating

- · We do this by: Being here and on time for classes and events
- · Being part of any leader-led discussion
- · Being part of any organized fellowship or servant night event
- · Participating fully in all aspects of confirmation
- · We believe in respecting the facilities and taking time to clean up our messes.

### We believe in having fun

- · We do this by: laughing with someone not at them
- · Being mindful of how something we find funny, others may not.

If you don't feel it's appropriate for a mentor, pastor or leader to hear, chances are it's not appropriate for you either.

### CHILD PROTECTION POLICY QUICK GUIDE

### For Your Protection and the child's...

- NEVER be alone with a child
- Leave classroom doors open
- · Strive for 2 adults in a room at all times.
- If a child requires assistance while in the washroom ensure the door is open and do not enter the stall.

# APPROPRIATE TOUCH

- Bending down to a child's eye level and speaking kindly, listening to him or her carefully.
- Taking a child's hand and leading him or her to an activity.
- Putting an arm around the shoulder of a child who needs quieting or comforting.
- Highfive as you say "You did so well concentrating!" or "I am happy to see you!"
- Patting a child on the hand, shoulders, or upper back to affirm him or her.
- Resting a hand on a child's shoulders or hand to keep his or her attention while you redirect the child's behavior.
- Using a hand over hand-guided assistance (preschooler learning to use scissors).
- Physical abuse is physical injury that is nonaccidental or that cannot be explained by what the parents or other caretakers say about how the injury happened.
- Neglect is the failure to provide for the child's basic or medical needs, including adequate supervision, or the failure to protect the child from harmful conditions
- Sexual abuse means that the child has been subjected to or threatened with the criminal sexual conduct as defined by Minnesota law, and includes violations of prostitution and pomography statutes.

### Who Should Report Child Abuse and Neglect

- Any person may voluntarily report abuse or neglect.
- Trinity Lutheran Church's staff are considered mandated reporters.
- · Call 911 if a child is in danger
- Faribault County Human Services Center (507) 526-3265.

### Transporting Children



- Children MUST ride in backseat.
- . Do not be alone with a child.
- Before driving, a copy of your car insurance must be on file and a background check completed.
- Driver must be 21 years old or older
- Driver will stay with child at the church until picked-up by authorized adult.

# DO NOT LEAVE CHILDREN

### Inappropriate Touch MUST AVOID

- Any physical contact of any kind that is done for the pleasure or satisfaction of the adult.
- · No kissing
- . No suggestive touching
- . No children on laps or piggy back rides

Anyone with a history of a sex offense forfeits the privilege of working with children, youth, and vulnerable adults.

### Signing Children In

- · Welcome the child when they arrive
- · Mark the attendance sheet

#### Signing Children Out

- Each child should only be released to the parent/guardian/authorized individual ONLY
- If you do not know the parent/guardian/authorized individual ask to confirm with listing in your classroom packet
- Children 8 or older may walk home if authorized on the Release Form.

#### Volunteer Screening Ensures Safety

- · Be connected to Trinity Lutheran Church
- Complete a Volunteer Registration form
- Attend volunteer training class
- Sign a Volunteer Code of Conduct form
- Complete a criminal background check including fingerprinting. TLC pays cost of fingerprinting and background checks.
