"There's Within My Heart a Melody"

From my earliest days, my mother would gently take my hand and lead me into the warm embrace of our church community. There, I would hear and sing songs of praise to God—songs that were either direct quotes from Scripture or deeply inspired by it. These melodies became the soundtrack of our spiritual upbringing. We sang them over and over, until they were no longer just lyrics on a screen or pages in a hymnal—they were written on our hearts.

As we grow older, these songs remain with us. They follow us through life, offering comfort, connection, and clarity in moments when everything else feels uncertain.

I witnessed this power firsthand with my grandmother. In her final years, she suffered from multiple mini-strokes that left her non-verbal and eventually unresponsive to direct questions. One day, while visiting her at her care facility, my mother turned on a gospel radio station. As we sat quietly, the song "I Come to the Garden Alone" began to play. After nearly a year of silence, my grandmother softly began to sing along with Alan Jackson. Her voice was faint, but unmistakable. It was as if the music had unlocked a door that had long been closed.

Stories like this are not uncommon. Music has a unique ability to reach those suffering from cognitive decline. As Psychology Today notes, "Music can open forgotten doors to our memories — such as weddings, school dances, and parties — with little cognitive effort" (Belfi, 2016). Music helps us recall the moments and emotions we've tied to a song, even when other memories fade.

This is why our church family is committed to serving the elderly in our community—many of whom feel forgotten by society. Some have no family nearby to visit them. Yet they find joy in the connections we bring. On the first Sunday of every month, we visit their care home and sing church hymns together. It's a time for conversation, laughter, and shared worship. They get to love on our young children, exercise their memories through song, and feel a renewed sense of worth and belonging.

As Scripture reminds us:

Leviticus 19:32 – "Stand up in the presence of the aged, show respect for the elderly and revere your God. I am the Lord."

This ministry is not limited to our children preparing for Lads to Leaders—it's open to everyone. Whether you sing, smile, or simply sit and listen, your presence matters. We invite you to join us in being a light to these precious souls who so graciously open their homes and hearts to us.

1 Peter 4:10 – "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

Let us continue to write love, service, and song on our hearts—and on theirs.
