### Pastor's Message

When I was in South Africa in 2019 we took a boat out to Robben Island, the island where Nelson Mandela and several others were imprisoned by apartheid. It was one of my favorite parts of our trip, the perseverance, the fight against injustice, and the unity of those imprisoned was nearly palpable. The sun was shining, the lilies blooming, and we saw several young wild animals wandering about the island; there was hope, joy, and new life. However, the boat ride back to the mainland from Robben Island was quite choppy and the sun quickly disappeared; the waves were so strong that water would splash in on the sides of the boat, everyone had to move towards the center. The boat was rocking side-to-side quite hard and several individuals had stomachs that were unable to handle the ride; you could read fear on the faces of some passengers. Although we made it back to the mainland without any major problems, it was not smooth sailing.

In Matthew 14, Jesus' disciples are witness to Jesus feeding of over 5,000 with only five loaves of bread and two fish and — there was much food left over! This would be reason enough for them to be amazed and full of hope, joy, and a new way of life. But, shortly after this the disciples were in a boat and encountered a storm. They were fighting heavy waves and were troubled. They saw someone (Jesus) walking towards them on the water and became full of fear thinking it was a ghost.

"But Jesus spoke to them at once. 'Don't be afraid,' he said. 'Take courage. I am here!'
Then Peter called to him, 'Lord, if it's really you, tell me to come to you, walking on the water.'
'Yes, come,' Jesus said.

So Peter went over the side of the boat and walked on the water towards Jesus.

But when he saw the strong wind and waves, he was terrified and began to sink. 'Save me, Lord!' he shouted."

Matthew 14:27-30 (NLT)

Peter often gets called out by today's church for things he says or does in Scripture that seem to be contrary to that of a "good disciple". But, let's give Peter kudos for even recognizing that it was Jesus' voice calling out to them! No one else responds to Jesus' voice or has the courage to ask Jesus to tell them to walk on water. Not only did Peter ask, but Peter responded with action when Jesus spoke. Yes, when Peter noticed the strong wind and waves, he began to sink. Yet still, when he began to sink Peter once again called on Jesus. If Peter had not taken his eyes off Jesus would he have sank? Possibly not, but regardless he was listening for Jesus' voice and he knew who to call out for when in trouble.

In my experience, it's not uncommon for there to be a time of fear, doubt, or struggle that follows up a time of hope, joy, and new life. I don't believe this is by chance, the enemy plants those seeds and tries to replace our amazement with fear, tries to shift our focus from Jesus to the storms, and tries to move us from new life to self-imprisonment. What is your response when these things happen? Do you listen for, and recognize, the voice of Jesus like Peter did? Do you have the courage to ask Jesus to call you out onto the water - and then step out when called? When you recognize the storms and begin to sink, do you call out to Jesus? It will not always be smooth sailing, Jesus will not always remove the storms, but let us keep our focus on the one who calls on the water and calms the storms. Together, let us listen for the voice of Jesus; let's respond to the call of Jesus; let us keep our eyes on Jesus - and when we begin to sink, let us call out to Jesus.



#### First Half 2023 Financial Update from Bob Becker, Finance Committee Chairman

Overall, the first half of 2023 was cautiously good. However, were it not for the increase in the investment portfolio and grant income for ACA, the church would have experienced a significant draw down on our reserves. As you can see from the charts below, Aley Church Operating Income fell short of Operating Expenses by \$50,652.28. While it is not unusual for expenses to exceed income in the first half of the year, our current position is not where we would like it to be.

The Finance Committee would like to thank everyone who has given financial gifts, such as cash, stock and mutual funds, to the church. We have been blessed by the gifts given both by name and anonymously. For our bookkeeping and your tax reporting purposes, it is important to give a name so that we are able to maintain accurate records. Please note that all individual gifts given to the church are not shared at the individual level. If you have given stock and/or mutual funds to the church this year, please check with the Financial Secretary, Mary Wesch, to make sure she is able to record the donation appropriately.
