Your Story - Distractions

God speaks to all of us. We won't necessarily hear his actual voice, but he makes himself known!

Balaam was and advisor to the king of Moab. Balaam had the reputation of being able to bless or curse people. Moab was a pagan civilization in the Promised Land that the Israelites was conquering. When the King saw the Israelites approaching, he sent Balaam to curse them. But on his way to do the king's bidding, Balaam encountered an angle of God who had been sent to give Balaam a message. The problem was, Balaam was so distracted by the thought of the reward the king had offered him, that he failed to recognize God's message. So God made himself known in a very hard-to-miss way! In the end, Balaam hear God's message to him – the message that he would be able to only bless the Israelites, not curse them (**Numbers 22:21-41**). You can see a video version of the story HERE. There are lots of distractions in our own lives and lots of people giving us messages. We have friends to talk to, TV shows to watch, games to play on our tablets. Lots of these messages are very interesting and enticing. Sometimes they are so interesting that we don't recognize that they are not helping us become better people, or giving us good information. God want us to hear His message, and he will make sure

that we hear it.

In the Bible there are lots of instances where God "spoke" to someone. It wasn't always a voice, though sometimes it was. Here are some examples of Gog "speaking."

To Paul in a flash of light and a loud voice – Acts 9:4

To Elijah in a still, small voice – 1 Kings 9:13

To Mary though an angel – Luke 1:28

To Samuel in a dream - 1 Samuel 3:10

Other people have described the "voice of God" as a calling or a 'gut feeling'. Sometimes is it an unexpected thought or a feeling. It might be an idea to do or say something that surprises you. Whatever, the manner, God will make His messages clear to you! And lucky for us, the Holy Spirit will help us recognize God's voice and understand the meaning.

Hearing and acting on the messages that God sends you is important part of developing your own testimony – a story that describes your relationship with God.
