The Adventures of Rev. Jennifer! Venturing into the Bible

We are about to start an excitina adventure in October. We will be starting an in-person Bible study. It will be held on a collection of Wednesdays at 12:30 p.m. Being a midday gathering, I am expecting that we will be primarily a group of "older" adults, which makes this even more of an excitina adventure. WAIT - did our new pastor just say that she thinks a midday Bible study with older adults is an exciting adventure?!? Yes, and let me tell vou a few reasons why.

First, older believers bring a lifetime of perspective to the text that can bring those familiar stories to life in powerful new ways. They can testify to how God has carried them through decades of events in their lives. They also understand how scripture holds different lessons for different seasons of life. An academic approach to study is fine, but nothing makes scripture more real and relevant than the depth of practical, lived-in wisdom.

To my younger folks who may be available for this midday experience, let me say a bit more about the benefit of attendina Bible study with the more seasoned members of the congregation. Nothing is better than the iov of intergenerational exchanges of perspective. Younger generations can learn from the wisdom of their elders, while older members can gain fresh perspectives on biblical teaching by seeing them through more youthful eyes.





History Highlights by Nancy Malone (Church Historian)

Leonard A. Bean was born on 07 May 1922 in Fairmont, West Virginia. His parents moved to Belmont Avenue in Niles when Leonard was twelve (12) years of age.

After graduating from Mentor High School in 1940, he was drafted in to the U.S. Army. In October 1945, two (2) months after Japan had surrendered, ending World War II, Bean was traveling through Central Germany unaware of what awaited him.

He arrived in Nuremberg, where he would stand witness to one of the most significant military tribunals in the history of modern warfare.

Following the Allied Forces' Victory, the three (3) major wartime powers.......United Kingdom, United States and the Union of the Soviet Socialist Republic.......began a series of trials punish those Nazi party members responible for war crimes. Those tribunals were set to take place in Neuremburg's Palace of Justice.

Sgt. Major Leonard Bean's battalion was sent to help oversee the event. Bean was the highest ranking enlisted man in his battalion. His time in Nuremberg and in the military came to a close in May 1946.

Leonard Bean returned to Niles and resided on North Bentley Avenue. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Niles.

There are three (3) benches at the patio of the Chapel entrance. The first bench (from left to right) is in memory of Leonard Bean and family members. Next time you walk past the benches, stop a moment and reflect.
