Labor Day is the time to spend the last days of the summer season. Many people celebrate with family or neighborhood barbecues, picnics, sporting events, and fireworks. Others will take their last weekend of vacation for the summer. Football season starts around Labor Day.

According to one early history of Labor Day, the event was in connection with a General Assembly of the <u>Knights of Labor</u> convened in New York City in September 1882. In connection with this clandestine Knights assembly, a public parade of various labor organizations was held on September 5 under the auspices of the <u>Central Labor Union</u> (CLU) of New York. Secretary of the CLU <u>Matthew Maguire</u> is credited for first proposing that a national Labor Day holiday subsequently be held on the first Monday of each September in the aftermath of this successful public demonstration.

Labor Day originated from the Knights of Labor and the Central Labor Union. Oregon was the first state to make it a holiday on February 21, 1887. In 1894, it became a federal holiday, officially celebrated by thirty states. It was approved as a national holiday following the deaths of workers from the U.S. Marshals and military during the Pullman Strike.

The Pullman Strike (May–July 1894) was a major railroad strike in the United States that highlighted labor unrest and led to significant federal intervention, ultimately shaping labor relations in the country.

The Pullman Strike originated in the Pullman Palace Car Company, which manufactured railroad cars in Pullman, Illinois, a company town created by George Pullman. During the economic depression that began in 1893, the company cut wages by about 25% while maintaining high rents and prices in the company town, leading to severe financial distress for workers and their families. When workers attempted to negotiate with Pullman, their requests were ignored, prompting them to strike on May 11, 1894, and it lasted through July 1894. This major railroad strike in the United States that highlighted labor unrest and led to significant federal intervention, ultimately shaped labor relations in the country.

History Highlights by Nancy Malone (Church Historian)

This headline is from the Niles Daily Times dated 03 July 1996. "First Pelton Award Given"

Vi Pelton was a member of our church and a former special education teacher in the Niles City Schools.

She died April 1996.

A long time supporter of Niles special education, Vi was considered by many to have been "First Lady of Special Education in Ohio".

The award was instituted by special education teachers Patti Pearlman and Sharon Minotti. It was funded by Vi's daughter, Kathy Skocik, a special education teacher in Burke, Virginia.

McKinley High School graduate Wilbur Lint was named the recipient of the first Vi Pelton "Self Reliance" award.

Wilbur, who graduated in auto mechanics, is employed by Trumbull Towing. He hopes to some day own a similar business.



In the United States, **National POW/MIA Recognition Day** is observed on the third Friday in September. It honors those who were prisoners of war (POWs) and those who are still missing in action (MIA). It is most associated with those who were POWs during the Vietnam War. National Vietnam War Veterans Day is March 29, the date in 1973 when the last US combat troops departed the Republic of Vietnam.
