

Mike's Message

What must I do to be saved? Acts 1-2

On His final appearance, Jesus instructed His apostles to go "into Jerusalem" and wait for the "promise of My Father" and "power from on high," and from there they would begin preaching "repentance for forgiveness of sins in the name of Jesus to all nations" (Luke 24:47-49; Acts 1:4-5, 8). Acts chapters 1 and 2 show all five commands fulfilled.

After Jesus ascended into heaven, the apostles "returned to Jerusalem" (Acts 1:14). Jesus explained that they would receive the "power from on high" and the "promise of the Father" (Luke 24:49), being "baptized with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:5). On the day of Pentecost, "they were all together in one place ... and were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance" (2:1-4). (They received the power from on high).

People from "every nation under heaven" were assembled in Jerusalem when the apostles proclaimed Jesus in different languages (2:5-6). Jesus had given them a commandment, "that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all nations beginning from Jerusalem" (Luke 24:47-49). They were in Jerusalem. All nations were there. They were clothed with the power from God. Everything was ready for the final command to be fulfilled.

The disciples reminded them that Joel and David's prophecies refer to the promised Messiah (Acts 2:14-35). Peter concluded, saying the Messiah was this same Jesus they had crucified (Acts 2:36). However, it was all a predetermined plan of God, and God did not leave Him in the power of death, but raised Him. They knew what Peter declared was true (Acts 2:22c). They had witnessed Jesus' miracles. They knew the promise was not about David because his tomb was undisturbed. They had to admit that Jesus was the resurrected Messiah because His tomb was empty and some of them had seen Him alive after His resurrection (Acts 1:3). They were among the very ones who had mocked and ridiculed Him. They were among the ones who would not permit Pilate to release Him, but cried repeatedly, "Crucify Him, Crucify Him" (Luke 23:21). A piercing pain of repentance struck the very core of their being. They cried out, "Brethren, what shall we do?" Peter's answer fulfilled the last thing Jesus told them they must do, "Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ, for the forgiveness of your sins" (Acts 2:38a). About 3000 obeyed that day and were added to the family of God.

Carpenter's Apprentice

Merriam-Webster.com defines 'buy-in' as: "acceptance of and willingness to actively support and participate in something (such as a proposed new plan or policy)." Buy-in makes a huge difference in whether or not new ideas work and rightfully, management/leadership types spend a lot of time considering how to influence and encourage buy-in. No matter how good the plan, if there is no buy-in, it will not be successful. But how does buy-in affect the rest of us? There are three key aspects to buy-in; acceptance, willingness, and participation. To be sure, there is a big difference in acceptance and whether or not we like or even agree with a situation. Young people often have to learn, as adults, some things are beyond our abilities to control, and sometimes things are going to be "just the way they are" for the foreseeable future. Acceptance of a situation is the first step in dealing with and potentially changing it. Fighting reality often prolongs the inevitable and affects our willingness. Willingness is really about our attitude. Good attitudes are contagious and make any situation more tolerable. Like acceptance, willingness doesn't always mean we support an idea or a change beyond the simple acceptance of the situation. Finally, participation is key. In order to truly buy-in, life must be more than words and thoughts. We must get involved. James chapter two comes to mind with regards to our faith, but the concept of faith and works also illustrates the acceptance, willingness and participation of buy-in. While so far, this article admittedly seems to be dealing with negative situations, our inability to buy in will also affect good situations and things we do believe in. One might ask why anyone wouldn't buy-in to something they believed. I do not know, but I believe church buildings around the world are full of those who "believe" but haven't bought-in every Sunday. I don't mean to imply they are not Christians but suggest they are missing out on the fullness and peace of a life in Christ. In speaking of His sheep, Jesus said, "I came that they may have life and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). The abundant life is critically affected by buy-in. Refusing to buy-in is holding back and holding back has a direct impact on success and contentment. Not buying in is like walking the fence. We do enough to appease whomever needs appeasement but hold on to what we want so tightly that we can never fully commit. Spiritually speaking, that is like trying to live in two worlds. Abundance from man's perspective is not always synonymous with abundance from God's perspective. My suggestion: whatever situation you are in in life, buy-in to make change. In regards to faith, Jesus said, "Come to Me, all who are weary and heavy-laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). "The peace of God, which surpasses all comprehen-

sion" (Philippians 4:7) comes only to those who come/go all the
