Mike's Message

Love and Forgiveness Luke 7:36-50

The story begins, "Now one of the Pharisees was requesting

Him to eat with him" (Luke 7:36a). The Pharisee's name was Simon (Luke 7:40, 43, 44). Simon's motivation for inviting Jesus to eat with him was less than honorable, and Jesus knew it (cf. John 2:25; Luke 7:39-40). Jesus "entered the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table." In those days, social customs and circumstances dictated that certain courtesies be extended to a guest who entered a home. First, the host would give the visitor a kiss of welcome (Matt. 26:49; Acts 20:37; Rom. 16:16). Then a servant would take a basin of water and a towel and wash the guest's feet (John 13:4, 5; 1 Tim. 5:10). A third courtesy often extended, especially to an honored guest, was the anointing of the head and or face with oil (Ps. 45:7; Eccl. 9:8; Amos 6:6). When Jesus arrived at Simon's house, not one of these comforts was extended to Him (see Luke 7:44-46). "And there was a woman in the city who was a sinner; and when she learned that He was reclining at the table in the Pharisee's house, she brought an alabaster vial of perfume" (Luke 7:37). Simon calls this woman "a sinner." Jesus confirmed that her sins were "many" (7:47). Most commentators argue that the word "sinner" in verse 37 is a euphemism for "prostitute, i.e., "an immoral woman." When the woman learned that Jesus was in Simon's house, taking a flask of perfume—perhaps once a tool of her trade, but now used as a way to express her love and gratitude—she hurried to the home of Simon. Upon reaching the Pharisee's house, she stood at the feet of Jesus, weeping, and her tears fell on His dirty feet. She began wiping His feet with her hair. Then she began to kiss his feet. Finally, she began pouring the perfume on his feet. We can only assume that the woman had heard Jesus preach forgiveness. She must have been sorrowful for her sins because she was weeping (Luke 7:38). She must have believed Jesus' teaching because He said to her, "Your faith has saved you" (Luke 7:50). There can be no doubt that she had changed her ways and was eternally grateful.

We can imagine the effect this was having on Simon's banquet. Remember the reputation this woman had in the city. Remember the uncharacteristic behavior of the woman intruding and weeping, wiping Jesus' feet with her hair, and pouring the fragrant oil on them. A dead silence must have fallen on the crowd, and every eye was concentrated on this woman and Jesus. How would Jesus respond to this sinful woman? (Continued next week).

Carpenter's Apprentice

In hindsight, I probably should have known. I probably should have been able to put the pieces together and figure it out. The clues were there; I just didn't see the context. To be sure there was deception, but still, I should have been able to see through it. The truth is, I could have been told, but I didn't want to listen. The surprise was complete.

Now, a couple of days later, I wonder if someone will be standing in line on judgement day thinking the same thing. That is my vision, and I am well aware the Bible does not say or even suggest a line, but that is the way my mind sees it. So, proceeding with the idea, can you imagine the dawning of realization as word filters back from the front of the line? This is judgement day! Maybe that someone will recall the day when a small group knocked on their door. Maybe they will think about a good friend who tried to tell them. It is possible they even went to church and now recall that verse. Where was it? The one that talked about the evidence of God could be seen ... oh yeah, Romans 1:19. "Because that which is known about God is evident within them; for God made it evident to them. For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes. His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse" (Romans 1:19-20). If they remembered the verse in Romans, maybe Psalm 19:1 will also come to mind- "The heavens are telling of the glory of God; and their expanse is declaring the work of His hands." Can you feel the dread as the sudden understanding comes? This was never intended to be a surprise. Oh sure, "No man knows the day or the hour" (Mark 13:32), but every man should be aware - there will be both a day and an hour when the Lord comes again. Sadly, for some, it will be a surprise - only it will not be the sounds of joyful celebration they hear when the appointed hour comes. They will hear sounds; sounds of weeping and the gnashing of teeth (Matthew 13:42), and sounds of terror, shame and suffering.

They say hindsight is 20/20, meaning if they look back, everyone can see clearly all the signs and signals they missed while moving forward. For Christians, hindsight is never our focus but our foresight. Are we prepared for what is coming? "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter. Many will say to Me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in Your name, and in Your name cast out demons, and in Your name perform many miracles?' And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; DEPART FROM ME, YOU WHO PRACTICE LAW-LESSNESS" (Matthew 7:21-23).
