Mike's Message

Training Children for God Deuteronomy 6:1-9

Training children for God may be the hardest thing parents will ever do. Training children for God requires parents to neglect their own desires for the good of the children. It often requires parents to go against a child's wishes, even if it hurts them emotionally. It requires moms and dads to set spiritual goals for the children, and set boundaries to keep the children on the path toward those goals (cf. Prov. 22:6). It requires enforced rules, and undivided dedication. Deuteronomy 6:1-9 may be the best text to explain how to train children for God. First, training children for God begins with parents who love God (vv. 4-6). Moses writes by inspiration, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. These words, which I am commanding you today, shall be on your heart" (vv. 5-6). To love God this way means that parents are everything God wants them to be. They are the perfect example for loving God. Parents must show that God is absolutely first in their lives (cf. Matt. 6:33). If someone asked your child, "Who are your parents?" How would your child respond? Parents cannot pretend to love God. Children see through pretending parents. If the parents say that God is the priority in their lives, but do not show it, the children receive mixed signals, and they will become what you show them every time.

Second, training children for God means that parents must verbally teach their children to love God (v. 7). Moses instructs, "You shall teach them diligently to your sons and shall talk of them when you sit in your house and when you walk by the way and when you lie down and when you rise up." This verse demands verbal instruction. Parents should have nightly devotionals, morning prayers, and daily Bible readings with their children. Godly parents will look for every opportunity to teach and instill in their children moral and spiritual values that reflect their own love for God.

Third, training children for God requires parents to display evidence of their love for God to everyone. Moses adds, "You shall bind them as a sign on your hand and they shall be as frontals on your forehead" (v. 8). Parents must be honest in every situation, take advantage of every opportunity to worship God, and insist your children do the same. Everyone you associate with must know that God is first in your life.

Finally, the home must be a reflection of the parents' love for God. "You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates" (v. 9). People must see the evidence that God lives in your home.

Train your children for God!

Carpenter's Apprentice

I remember back in Junior High School taking a very basic class in computer programming. It was basic on a number of levels but largely because computer programming was in its infancy and politicians hadn't invented the internet yet! My best friend Fred had already completed basic programming and had moved on to Pascal. For him, programming seemed to come easy. About the only thing I understood were 'ifthen' statements. These statements called for the computer to make a decision. If certain conditions are met, the computer does one thing: if they are not met – another. While computer programming may only go back 50 years or so, 'if-then' statements have been around a long time. While certainly not the first, a particularly poignant 'if-then' can be found in Exodus 15:26. The Israelites have just crossed the Red Sea and witnessed not only the destruction of the Egyptian army in the sea but over the last six months or so had observed the utter destruction of Egypt, the debunking of the Egyptian gods and undeniable evidence the God of Abraham. Isaac and Jacob is the one true and living God. He was their God and now he made them an offer, "If you will diligently listen to the voice of the LORD your God, and do that which is right in his eyes, and give ear to his commandments and keep all his statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you that I put on the Egyptians, for I am the LORD, your healer." Very simple, very straight forward, the health care plan I have been looking for! What a bargain! Amazing! How incredibly foolish the Israelites must have been to not take Him up on this. If you diligently listen, do and keep, then I will protect. Time and time again we read of the Israelites grumbling against the Lord and ultimately wandering in the wilderness for forty years as punishment for siding with ten of the twelve spies who had little if any faith in God. Only two of the 'originals' delivered from Egypt would see the Promised Land (Numbers 14:22-23). How could the Israelites be so short sighted – blind even, as to not recognize the power and the promise of the Lord. Silly Israelites! What would you do different if you had their 'ifthen'? "Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did" (1 Corinthians 10:6) so surely we can learn from their mistakes. While you are thinking about what you would do differently, think about this verse: "Therefore, brothers, be all the more diligent to make your calling and election sure, for if you practice these qualities you will never fall" (2 Peter 1:10). Hey! What do you know? It's an 'if-then' for us! We can't really laugh at the Israelites and their bad decisions if we are going to do the same thing. How about this one, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). --jeff
