



Readings from Scripture are proclaimed

When the priest or deacon gives his homily, Jesus is present, and God speaks to us



Just as Jesus taught the people long ago, he teaches us today when we hear Scripture readings at Mass



At the Last Supper, Jesus told us to remember and share in the sacrifice He made for us

this is why we celebrate the Eucharist every week





We gather around the table of the Lord, share a sacred meal, celebrate the mystery of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection



Heaven and earth come together in this wonderful celebration



At the Last Supper - and in every Eucharist -Jesus gives His whole self to us

The bread IS His body The wine IS His blood






 Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.






Receiving the Eucharist



Bow, then create a throne for God with your hands, one hand under the other, and keep your eyes on Christ



Receiving Holy Communion in Your Hands





- > Be careful to consume any crumbs remaining on your hands
- >The Host must be consumed immediately
- > No one should walk away with the Eucharist in his/her hand

Receiving Holy Communion in Your Hands





LET Christ's Body settle onto your hands – it's not catch!

You should not receive Jesus in your hand if:

- you are holding something (or someone) in your hands or arms
- there is something that would diminish the attention and care you can give to the Host in your hand (e.g., one of your hands is bandaged)
- > you are wearing gloves





Receiving Holy Communion on Your Tongue

Approach the Priest or Eucharistic Minister who lifts the Host so you can see it and says *The Body of Christ*


Say Amen

Open your mouth and extend your tongue a little bit to receive the Host



> Stay still until after the Host is placed on your tongue!


