DIRECTIONS ON HOW TO HEAR A SERMON

George Whitefield was born in Gloucester, England, December 27, 1714, and died in Newburyport, Massachusetts, on September 30, 1770. It was suggested by students of preaching that Whitefield's power over his hearers may have been due in part to the fact that he told them how to listen to his sermons:

- 1. Come to hear the sermons, not out of curiosity, but from a sincere desire to know God's Word and to do God's will.
- 2. By prayer, prepare your heart before you hear, and then give diligent attention to the things that are spoken while you are hearing the Word of God.
- 3. Please do not entertain any prejudice against the preacher.
- 4. As you ought not to hold any prejudice against, so you should be very careful not to depend too much upon the preacher, or to think of him more highly than you ought to think.
- 5. Seek to make a particular application of every-thing that is preached to your heart and life.
- 6. Before you hear, as you hear, and after you hear God's Word preached, pray that he will give your preacher wisdom to understand, power to speak his Word, and ask him to grant you a will and ability to put in practice what he shall show you from his Word to be your duty.

HARLAN COUNTY CHRISTIAN SCHOOL


