

A Blessed Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica! Once again this week we find ourselves on what ordinarily is a Sunday in Ordinary Time, but what is in fact the celebration of some other occasion. For instance, just last Sunday we celebrated the

Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed. Earlier this year we celebrated the **Exaltation of the Cross.** Saints Peter and Paul, and the **Presentation of the** Lord all on what would otherwise be Ordinary Time Sundays. Why is that? Well for my fellow "Liturgi-nerds" there is something called a Table of Liturgical Days According to Precedence. According to that table



produced by the Church, the feast days listed above all take precedence over Sundays in Ordinary Time. We have had an unprecedented amount of these Feast Days this year! The more you know...

Why might this feast, the Dedication of the Lateran



Basilica in Rome, take precedence over an Ordinary time Sunday? The Basilica of St. John Lateran was the first Catholic Church built in the western world. The Roman Emperor Constantine had the Basilica constructed on land donated by the Lateran family (there was no person named

"St. John Lateran") after he won victory in battle attributed to the Christian God in the year 312. The Basilica, which is dedicated to two Saints (John the Baptist and John the Evangelist), is the Cathedral of Rome. As Roman Catholics then, this physical Church building stands as the sacrament of the Church, our Mother, built of living stones. What would we do without the Church? Without the Sacraments? Without that which unifies us? The Church is the great vessel leading us on towards eternal life! It is definitely fitting



that, once every 7 years or so we "bump" an Ordinary Time Sunday and celebrate the Dedication of this glorious Church. Enjoy the Feast!

### Heavenly Hero for November: St. Martin of Tours

**Born**: 326 AD

**Died:** November 8, 397 **Feast Day:** November 11

Patronage: recovering alcoholics, innkeepers, soldiers, and tailors

Martin was born in Hungary. Shortly before his birth, Christianity had been made legal. Before, if you were Christian, you could be arrested and killed just for

believing in Jesus!

Martin's heart longed for something more and when he was ten years old he learned about Jesus. He knew that is what his heart was seeking so he became a Christian. When he was 15 he was forced to become a soldier because that is what the law said he had to do. St. Martin made up his mind to serve Jesus as a soldier.



One very cold day, Martin was wearing a warm cloak and riding his horse when he met an almost naked beggar shivering with cold. Quickly, Martin took off his cloak, slashed it in half, and gave the beggar one half of his cloak. Many people laughed at Martin for ruining his beautiful cloak. That night, Martin dreamed that Jesus was the beggar now wearing his half cloak. In Martin's dream Jesus said to the angels and saints around him, "See! This is the mantle (cloak) that Martin gave me."

Over the next two years Martin's faith continued to grow and eventually his duties as a soldier went against his beliefs as a Christian. One day, he refused to go and fight in a battle. His commander put him into jail saying that he would stay in jail until the battle the next day. Then, Martin was to go into battle—without his sword. The opposing army sent word that day that they wanted peace. There was no battle; Martin was released from battle and the army.

Over time, Martin founded two monasteries, became a bishop, built churches and freed many prisoners. Our Chapel at St. Raphael is named after St. Martin of Tours where there is a stained glass window with his image on it behind the altar.

**Talking Point with Children**: The life of St. Martin of Tours shows us that even when others may make fun of us for our faith, we need to be brave and stand up for our belief in Jesus. His kindness to the beggar also reminds us that Jesus said "Whatever you do for the least of these, you do for me." That means that like St. Martin, we should have special care for the poor and needy.

**Action Step for Children:** St. Martin showed great charity when he shared his cloak with a man in need on a cold windy day. As a family, go through your closet and donate gentle used items to St. Vincent DePaul.

### Saintly Solutions

As a mother, I've learned so much about the lives of the saints by sharing stories about these holy men and women with my kids when they were younger. In teaching them, I saw the importance of learning about saints and their lives. Those known to all of us, and those who went to their graves after lives of holy service and living, never formally canonized but were witnesses to the true meaning of the word "faith." Women like my grandmother and mother who led their families to lives within the Catholic Church. Evangelists like my friend Matt, who was fearless when it came to inviting friends to Mass and would take on any apologetics argument with gusto and passion. Teachers such as my friend Sherri, whose work in her classroom touched countless lives and led thousands to Jesus by the way she so vibrantly reflected his love to others.

These days, in my quiet moments of prayer, as well as those times throughout the day when I say a quick prayer, I turn to a community of trusted saints and ask for their guidance and intercession in our daily lives. When I was a young mom and it seemed like the most significant thing I accomplished was doing the dishes, St. Therese of Lisieux and her "little way" was never far from my mind. As I became a more mature mom, St. Elizabeth and her joyful later-in-life pregnancy offered inspiration. As my kids grew older, St. Monica became a trusted friend. I strive every day to live life according to the examples set by their lives of great virtue, courage, and faith. Most days I fall short, but it's wonderful to know that I have their help and encouragement along my own path to heaven.

### **Emptiness & Abundance**

Over the last several weeks, we have considered images of emptiness from the Scriptures and seen how each empty space, when made available to the Lord, has become a place of abundance.

Today, we turn our attention to the Gospel of Luke. Jesus often warns us about the danger of placing our hope in possessions, and he picks up this theme in this parable told in Luke 12:16-21:

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, 'Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!' But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for the one who stores up treasure for himself but is not rich in what matters to God."

What does it mean to be rich in what matters to God? I think the answer is connected to our theme of emptiness and abundance. True wealth is not found in material possessions, investments, or bigger barns. Depending on these things for our security will disappoint us in the end. Instead, true wealth is found in depending on God. What matters to God is not how large our bank account is, but that we trust in him to provide for us, now and into eternity.

Do we trust the Lord with our empty places? Are we able to see them with gratitude? Do we offer them to him in faith, trusting him to fill them with the abundance he desires for us? Are we rich in what matters to God?

As we enter soon into the season of Thanksgiving, we will rightly give thanks for the many ways God has blessed us. What if we also gave thanks for the places where we feel empty, believing that these also are a gift from God, spaces where his true riches and abundance can be given?

Praying for true riches in Jesus in all our empty places.




