

As friends and followers of Jesus, we are devoted to fostering households and communities of discipleship through the mission and ministry of the Catholic Church.

#### Dear Parishioners.

Last weekend, we began the season of Advent -- a time of grace and preparation to receive Jesus in our hearts. We also started the last month of 2023 -- a year filled with great challenges, but also with faith and renewed hope. This second Sunday of Advent, our Scripture readings give us hope that Jesus is coming, but also offer us a challenge to prepare the way before him.

Today we hear the very beginning of Mark's Gospel, the beginning of Jesus' public life. We're introduced immediately to John the Baptist, a prophet whose calling was to prepare the way for God's entry into humanity, by announcing that the long-awaited day of salvation was about to dawn. His message was simple, straightforward and urgent: do penance and reform your lives by prayer and fasting, for the Kingdom of God is at hand!

John the Baptist's message is urging us to prepare a place for the Lord's entry into our lives and hearts. This season of Advent is an invitation to conversion, and John the Baptist gives us some practical advice on how to change our lives for the better. He talks about filling in valleys of prejudice, leveling down mountains of pride, and straightening out the crooked paths of injustice.

The bottom line is that today's gospel challenges us to ask ourselves what areas in our lives may need a complete turning around to allow God to come closer to us. Preparing the way for the Lord may mean walking a new path. Perhaps there are dark corners within ourselves which we don't want disturbed, even though we're aware that they prevent God from entering into our innermost being.


This Advent time of prayer and penance provides us an opportunity to make a fresh start. Preparing a way for God in our hearts takes work, time and perseverance. It demands listening to what God is saying to us through His Word, and acting upon it by making changes in our behavior.

John the Baptist also reminds us that we have the important task of announcing Christ to others. Our everyday lives need to tell those around us - through our acts of kindness, compassion, honesty and faithfulness - that Jesus is right here walking the journey with us.

Jesus' Gospel message of life and love is the only true answer to the problems plaguing our troubled and darkened world today. May we all accept John the Baptist's invitation to turn this Advent season into a spiritual homecoming, by making the necessary preparations for the arrival of the Savior into our lives and into our homes.



Feast of the Immaculate Conception

Let's start by clearing up a common misconception about the Immaculate Conception. It is not the virginal conception of Jesus Christ in Mary, Nor is it the virginal birth of Jesus by Mary.

The Immaculate Conception refers to the doctrine that Mary, from the very moment of her conception, was never stained by original sin. The word *immaculate* literally means pure, or without blemish.

Here's how Pope Pius IX defined the doctrine in his proclamation of December 8, 1854. "The most Blessed Virgin Mary was, from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of the human race, preserved immune from all stain of original sin."

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a holy day of obligation in the United States, where Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception is the patron. Make Mass part of your celebration of the feast day!

Have your older children and teens listen carefully at Mass for references to the doctrine of the Immaculate conception, not only in the readings and the homily, but also in the prayers the priest says during the liturgy of the Eucharist.

The Hail Mary and Hail, Holy Queen are basic Marian prayers that are good for Catholic kids to know by heart. And the Magnificat, Mary's own prayer and her longest speaking part in the Bible, is a wonderful prayer for any feast day.

#### An invitation to ponder: St. Teresa of Avila: The "Third Rooms" in the Interior Castle of Our Souls

Last week, we spent some time with Teresa in the "second rooms" of our souls. Here we are challenged to persevere in the spiritual life, to continue being faithful to prayer even when it may not come with consoling feelings, and to continue to grow in love for God and our neighbor, especially by fighting against our ingrained sinful habits.

Those who have entered the "third rooms" of their interior castles are described by Teresa in this way: "They long not to offend His Majesty, even guarding themselves against venial sins; they are fond of penance and setting aside periods for recollection; they spend their time well, practicing works of charity toward their neighbors; and are very balanced in their use of speech and dress and in governing their households those who have them" (Interior Castle, 3.1.5). In other words, people who inhabit these rooms in their souls shine with goodness. They love God and others well.

The danger here is that such souls may be tempted to think that they have arrived in the spiritual life, when in fact they are only just beginning! God has so much more for them! A deeper purification awaits in which they will be freed not just from sinful habits, but the deeply embedded selfishness we all carry. Learning and embracing true humility is the way forward - to know ourselves as we really are, as beloved sons and daughters (always!) but also as creatures who far too easily fall into self-deception and self-seeking and who remain in need of God's mercy. In these third rooms. we must humbly seek God's will for our lives, not our own, and grow in trust that he truly does use all things for our good.

If you've been a bit slow to enter into Advent, it's not too late. Join us Sunday night for our Second Sunday Holy Hour. There will be time for quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, the opportunity to receive God's mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and a guided Advent meditation for your personal prayer. The holy hour begins at 4 pm and concludes before the 5 pm Sunday Mass.

Let us remain together in the heart of Jesus, and pray for one another!

## Praying with Next Sunday's Gospel:

#### John the Baptist Prepares the Way

Our Gospel text for next Sunday, the third week of Advent, is John 1:6-8, 19-28. This week, we heard the story of John the Baptist announcing Christ's coming in the Gospel of Mark. Next week, we will turn to John's account of this story.

- Set aside 10-15 minutes to pray with the passage. Find it in your Bible or online at https:// bible.usccb.org/bible/readings/121723.cfm.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your time of prayer, spend a moment remembering how God always gazes upon you with love, and then read the passage slowly.
- What word or phrase captures your attention in this passage? Why? What might God be saying to you and your life today through that word or phrase?
- The Jewish people are wondering who this mysterious figure in the desert is. Is John the Baptist the Christ? Is he Elijah, the Old Testament prophet promised to return to foretell the Christ's coming? John claims to be neither of these people. Instead, he quotes a passage from Isaiah, "I am the voice of the one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord." Are you ever tempted to claim to be more than or different than who you are? How does John's example of honest humility help you?
- John the Baptist is the voice leading the way to Jesus. How do you use your voice to point to Jesus and make it easier for people to find him? How might God be offering you opportunities to do this? Share your thoughts and feelings about this with Jesus.
- Close by praying the Our Father.



#### Make Your IRA Charitable Rollover Gift

Did you know you can reduce your taxes by making a gift from your IRA directly to charity? If you are 70 1/2 years old or older, you can make a charitable gift up to \$100,000 directly from your IRA. This direct distribution can be made to a qualified charity such as your parish, a Catholic school, the Bishop's Appeal, a diocesan ministry. the Catholic Foundation, or another Catholic charity.

An IRA charitable rollover gift is an easy way to help fulfill our Church's mission and reduce your taxable income. Your gift will qualify for your required IRA minimum distribution. Also, you will not have to pay federal income tax on the amount given directly from your IRA to a charity. Qualified direct distributions made from your IRA are not subject to income tax.

In past years, a distribution from your IRA would have been taxed as ordinary income. However, Congress passed a law several years ago making the IRA charitable rollover permanent. Here is how the IRA charitable rollover works:

- 1. You must be 70 1/2 years of age.
- 2. Your gift must come from an IRA (not a TSA or 401k).
- 3. Your gift is a direct transfer to a qualified charity such as the Catholic Foundation.
- 4. The maximum amount you can transfer is \$100.000.

To qualify as an IRA charitable rollover, your gift must be made by December 31, 2023.

It is also important not to withdraw funds prior to making your gift. Instead, distribute the funds directly from your IRA to the qualified charity.

We encourage families interested in making an IRA charitable rollover gift to speak with their financial advisor. For more information about how you can benefit from an IRA charitable rollover, please contact your IRA administrator and/or tax preparer. Please consider a charitable rollover gift from your IRA to St. Raphael Parish, the Catholic Foundation, the Bishop's Appeal, or other Catholic charity. Make your gift as soon as possible to avoid any processing delays at the end of December, and don't miss the opportunity to make your IRA charitable rollover gift this year! 
