

Devotion for January: The Holy Name of Jesus

What's in a name? Any parent will tell you that the answer is A LOT. When parents are expecting a child they spend a great deal of time selecting a name that is the right fit. Our name is something that (typically) follows us our whole lives and it is usually the way in which we are introduced to new friends, potential employers, and pretty much anyone else we come in contact with.

All that being said, it can be argued that the most well known name of all time is the name of Jesus. In fact, the name of Jesus is so important that the entire month of January is devoted to the Holy Name of Jesus. Why dedicate a whole month to Jesus' name? Wouldn't it be better to focus on a biblical event or the inspiring life of a saint? Here are three important reasons to honor Jesus' Name:

The Bible "tells me so": Paul tells us in his Letter to the Philippians, "at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth" (2:10). The name of Jesus was first spoken by the Archangel Gabriel and is adored in heaven. We are called to adore Jesus' sweet name as part of the communion of saints.

There is Power in the Name: Jesus taught that where two or three are gathered in His name. He would be in their midst (Mt 18:20). The blind man cried out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" (Lk 18:38), and his sight was restored. Demons were cast out of the possessed by Jesus' name (Acts 16:18: 19:16), Celebrating the feast of the Holy Name of Jesus reminds us that we should pray in the name of Jesus, because His name is powerful for those who call upon Him.

We are Saved in His Name: An angel tells St. Joseph to name the child Jesus because he will save us from our sins (see Mt 1:21). Jesus is the key to our salvation and the source of our joy. We honor Jesus' holy name because it has been spoken in every corner of the world, and when proclaimed to those who have never heard His name, lives are changed.

Be on the look out this month for ways to honor Jesus' name as a family. One very simple way is to pray the Jesus prayer daily in January. It is one of the shortest, but most powerful prayers we can teach our children. With the entire communion of saints we pray: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner. Amen."

We celebrate the feast of the Epiphany on January 7. This special day celebrates the coming of the Magi—the three wise men (or kings), from the East who followed a star and came to adore Jesus. The definition of the word "epiphany" is a divine or super-natural manifestation, just as the wise men discovered Jesus.

Who were the three kings? Their story is shrouded in legend and tradition but it is believed that they were skilled at watching the stars. They knew about the prophesies that spoke of the Messiah and when they saw the bright star they knew something special was about to happen. That the messiah had finally arrived!


There are many ways all around the world to celebrate the Epiphany. In some countries, children open presents on the Epiphany instead of Christmas. Some people believe the magi bring the presents instead of Santa Claus. Christmas decorations can be taken down on the Epiphany but a few things should be left up until the Presentation of the Lord.

On the Feast of the Epiphany, it is very special to ask the blessing of God on your house throughout the following year. The blessing can help us remember that God is a part of every aspect of our daily lives. The prayer and directions on how to do the blessing are in the bulletin this week.

The Epiphany should remind us of how special Jesus is and that we should spend our lives seeking Him. Jesus is the light for everyone and if we follow Him we will never go astray.

An invitation to ponder:

St. Teresa of Avila: More on The "Fourth Rooms" in the Interior Castle of Our Souls

Before Christmas, we entered with Teresa into the "fourth rooms" of our souls and saw that these rooms represent a time of significant transition in our spiritual lives. This time of transition can be disorienting. Old and familiar ways of relating to God somehow no longer seem to "work." When these souls try to pray in the ways they are used to, they experience a dryness and frustration that endures and is unlike the episodic dryness they may have experienced on and off in prayer before. Because they are faithful and desire to pray, they may double down on their prayer practices, yet that only seems to make things worse. They want to pray, they are faithful to their times of prayer, but things consistently feel off.

These souls, when they pay attention, begin to notice that they are drawn to a simple, quiet presence with the Lord. It often feels to them like they are "doing things wrong" in these moments – because it seems like they aren't doing anything at all! What they are doing is surrendering more deeply to God and to his guiet, hidden work within them. At times the quiet will overtake them in a way that is deeply joyful, peaceful, and full of the sense that God is with them and loves them. When this happens, they emerge more refreshed from a few minutes of prayer than from hours of their previous ways of praying.

John of the Cross, a friend of Teresa and co-reformer of the Carmelite religious order, gives this time of transition the now famous phrase, "the dark night of the soul." It is the first of two "dark nights" a faithful soul may face in the spiritual life. We often throw that phrase around for any time when things are spiritually difficult, but John has a more precise understanding. A dark night is not just a challenging season or a time when it's hard to trust in God. It is a time in which God is working in a soul to purify it from its attachments even to good things and make it ready for a deeper life with him.

Let us remain together in the heart of Jesus, and pray for one another!

Praying with Next Sunday's Gospel:

Our Gospel text for next Sunday is John 1:35-42. John the Baptist points out Jesus,

the Lamb of God, to two of his disciples, and they begin to follow him. One of them, Andrew, brings his brother Simon and introduces him to the Lord.

- Set aside 10-15 minutes to pray with the passage. Find it in your Bible or online at https:// bible.usccb.org/bible/readings/011424.cfm.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your time of prayer, spend a moment remembering how God always gazes upon you with love, and then read the passage slowly.
- What word or phrase captures your attention in this passage? Why? What might God be saying to you and your experiences today through that word or phrase?
- During the Advent season, we read in the Gospel of Mark how John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus. We see him doing that once again in this passage as he points Jesus out to two of his disciples and encourages them to follow him. Who do you identify with most -John the Baptist, who points others to Jesus, or his disciples, who need to be pointed to Jesus? Talk to Jesus about what you most need to help others find Jesus – and/or to find him yourself.
- When the first disciples ask Jesus where he is staying, he invites them to come and see. Following Jesus is not an academic exercise, but a lived experience of sharing in his life. Have you ever had an experience of Jesus inviting you to "come and see"? What was that like? What did you learn and how did it transform vou?
- Close by praying the Our Father.



Eucharist Stolen from City-Wide Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel

The evening of Friday, December 29, 2023, the Holy Eucharist was stolen from the Oshkosh Adoration Chapel located at the Most Blessed Sacrament Saint Mary site (605 Merritt Ave).

The Oshkosh parishes are working diligently with the Oshkosh Police Department and the Diocese of Green Bay to investigate the event and recover the Eucharist. Anyone who has any information is asked to contact the Oshkosh Police Department non-emergency number at (920) 236-5700.

The adoration chapel will remain closed until the investigation is complete and a robust security solution is identified.

Because we believe Jesus is truly present - body, blood, soul and divinity - in the consecrated host at Mass, what was stolen is not simply bread, but Jesus himself. It pains us to hear or witness offenses against the Eucharist because it is not an offense against just a piece of bread, but an offense against the One we love with all of our heart, Jesus Christ.

In order to repair the spiritual damage done in such a situation, the Church recommends prayers of reparation. This type of prayer can be thought of as a "prayer of love," proclaiming to Jesus the love you have for him, even when others reject him. These prayers provide an opportunity to recognize the damage sin has upon the world and to repair it by our acts of love.




