

Dear Parishioners,

Happy First Sunday of Lent! Lent is a special time of year for us as Catholic Christians. It is a time of renewing and deepening our relationship with God, and putting our faith into practice through prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Prayer is our relationship with God. Prayer involves both personal, private prayer as well as community prayer. Examples of personal prayer include a morning offering prayer upon waking, praying with scripture (perhaps the daily Mass readings), spiritual reading, time



with the Lord in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament (in church or our Eucharistic chapel), night prayers reflecting on the day and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Communal prayer includes Sunday Mass, daily Mass if possible at times, grace before meals, the rosary, Stations of the Cross.

Fasting is a way of creating space for God. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are asked to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, having only one full meal and no snacking on those days. All over the age of 14 are asked to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent. We also fast during Lent from other things, perhaps from a favorite food or from gossip or from excessive screen time on our phones or devices. Fasting opens up time for prayer and service, and the discipline of fasting helps strengthen us spiritually. The hunger from fasting from food makes us more aware of the needs of others.


Almsgiving is putting into practice what comes from our prayer and fasting. Fasting from food may inspire us to serve at a food pantry or give money to a charitable organization such as Catholic Relief Services (recipient of donations from Rice Bowls). Our prayer may make us aware of needs where we can give of our resources to assist others. Almsgiving makes us more generous people.

Let us pray for one another throughout our Lenten journey.





Praying the Stations of the Cross with your kids

Family Outreach Corner

Praying the Stations of the Cross is a great way to introduce your kids to the heart of the Christian story. It's a way to introduce them to the story of Jesus' Passion (his suffering and death). But the Stations are more then the retelling of a story; it is a way to engage kids at a spiritual level.

Since the earliest centuries of the Church, Christians have made pilgrimages to Jerusalem in order to retrace the steps of Jesus during his suffering and death. Around the fifteenth century, Christians began the practice of prayerfully meditating on the Passion of Christ by reproducing that pilgrimage in what became known as the Stations of the Cross.

Why mediate on Jesus' suffering? Most people want to avoid suffering, not spend time imagining it! But suffering is a reality that everyone has to deal with in life. In Jesus, God entered into our suffering in order to save us. By walking with Jesus, we join our suffering to his, knowing that he will lead us through it into the new life in the Resurrection.

Here are some ways to pray the Stations with your family.

Pray the Stations of the Cross here at St. Raphael. The Stations are depicted on the side walls in the nave of the church.

Pray the Stations at home. Praying the Stations at home offers flexibility and convenience for families with young children. Find an illustrated guide or artwork to represent the stations.

Wiggly, distracted kids? Here are a few strategies for keeping them engaged:

- Do one Station every day over the course of a few weeks.
- If they're old enough to read, let them take part of the prayer at each Station.
- Use a video. Search online for age-appropriate Stations of the Cross videos. There are some great ones on Formed.

An invitation to ponder:

Cultivating Interior Silence

We know that silence is important in our spiritual lives. It's hard to hear the guiet and gentle voice of

God in a world that constantly inundates us with noise. It can be even harder to hear that voice through the noise in our own minds and hearts. This Lent. I'd like to encourage us to all be more intentional about creating space to pay closer attention to the Lord through the practice of silence.

Recently, when I was visiting the Shrine at Holy Hill with a friend, I stumbled across a book that has helped to expand my understanding of silence. Fr. Basil Nortz, ORC, in Holy Silence: A Practical Guide to Recollection in God, expounds on the reflections of a Carmelite nun. Marie-Aimee de Jesus, about twelve different kinds of holv silence. We'll look at one kind each week between now and Pentecost.

The first kind of silence is the one we usually think of – the silence of speech. Speaking is a necessary and beautiful part of human existence. Although many species have their ways of communicating, our capacity for complex thought and expression in language sets humanity apart. There is nothing quite like hearing a child say her first words, or like hearing someone we love share their innermost thoughts with us. The Son of God himself is the Divine Word. Our trouble is that we misuse the gift of speech all too often. We say hurtful things. We lie. We gossip. We complain. We are foolish and flippant. And so there is good reason to put effort into training our tongues to be silent. If we are always talking, we also don't have much space for listening to God or each other. The practice of silence of speech is not an end in itself, but it does create space for what is true, beautiful, and good to be spoken and heard.

How might God be inviting you to set a guard over your lips? Are there forms of speech you would like to let go of this Lent, gossiping or complaining, for example? Is there something you need to turn off to have more silence in your home, car, or at work? How would you like to use your words to build others up? What do you think you might hear in the quiet?

Let us remain together in the heart of Jesus, and pray for one another!






Praying with Next Sunday's Gospel:

Next Sunday, the Second Sunday of Lent, our Gospel

text is Mark 9:2-10. Jesus takes three of his disciples on a hike with a most extraordinary view his glory.

- Set aside 10-15 minutes to pray with the passage. Find it in your Bible or online at https:// bible.usccb.org/bible/readings/022524.cfm.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your time of prayer, spend a moment remembering how God always gazes upon you with love, and then read the passage slowly.
- Peter, James, and John are given the extraordinary gift of seeing Jesus in his glory and hearing the voice of God the Father say, "This is My Beloved Son." Two of the Old Testament's greatest heroes, Moses and Elijah, appear alongside Jesus. They are rightly terrified and don't know what to say. Try to imagine yourself in the scene. What would you be thinking? How would you respond?
- Peter, even in his fear, recognizes that it is good to be there, witnessing this amazing moment and witnessing Jesus' true glory. Have you ever had an experience like this, a combination of holy fear and amazement before the Lord? What was that like? What did you learn? What do you think Peter, James, and John are learning about Jesus?
- Jesus follows up this divine revelation by speaking about his coming death resurrection. Peter, James, and John are clearly puzzled. Has Jesus ever puzzled you? How has he resolved your questions? Or are you still waiting? Talk with him about this.
- Close by praying the Our Father.



February 2024 Mission Team Experience



Our Outreach Mission Team to Breathitt County and Jackson, KY had a very productive, ecumenical week. Mennonite Disaster Services [MDS] hosted our volunteers. MDS Project Leaders and volunteers worked side by side with our team. We shared experiences, visited with some old friends, made new friends, and worked on 3 houses. Projects included roofing, siding, and installing doors and windows to weatherproof one house; and insulating walls, hanging sheetrock, and "mudding and taping" in two other houses. The team collectively donated 368 hours of volunteer time, valued at \$11,400.00 One of

the new house recipients joined us for supper on Wednesday evening. She shared some of her life story; her personal experiences during and after the 2022 flood; and how she and the Jackson community appreciated all that Holy Cross Parish has done to improve life in Jackson, even though most of the community is not Catholic. Holy Cross Parish Life Director Sr. Amy Westbrook was a guest at that supper, and her vision is to continue that legacy well into the future. With our continued support, we know she will succeed.

Growth of the **Knights of Columbus**

The first councils in the late 1800's were all in Connecticut. By 1904 there were only five states that didn't have a

council. By the time of the first annual convention in 1884 the order was prospering. By 1889 there were 300 councils, comprising 40,000 members (about twice the seating capacity of Madison Square Garden). Twenty years later in 1909, there were 230,000 knights and 1300 councils. The one millionth member joined in 1921.

Today the Knights of Columbus has councils in Canada, Philippines, Mexico, Poland, Dominican Republic, Puerto Rico, Panama, Bahamas, Virgin Islands, Cuba, Guatemala, Guam. Ukraine and South Korea.


