#### Dear Parishioners.

Give thanks to the Lord for He is good...His mercy endures forever. Lent is many things; a journey, the desert, fish fries, prayer, fasting, almsgiving. Lent is ashes, dust, silence and stillness. Perhaps one component that we seldom think of or attend are The Stations. Now, I'm not referring to gas stations (they have a limited amount of time left) but what I am referring to are The Stations of the Cross. Back during my days in college, when I was not going to Mass on a regular basis, The Stations became a bit of a spiritual lifeline for me. During Lent in particular, I would drop in on a Friday at Saint Anthony Parish and participate in this ancient Christian devotional. Maybe because I remembered with fondness my home parish of Corpus Christi in




Sturgeon Bay. There are fourteen Stations in total representing different aspects of Jesus' passion and death. My particular attraction is to the Saint Alfonso Liguori Stations. Saint Alfonso was focused on Our Lord's passion as a means to grow more affectionately in love for Him and His will. By seeing Jesus' will conformed to the Father, the display of Christ's love in the Stations become, in effect, the patten of Divine love itself. Sacrificial, incarnational, pursuant of the sinners redemption, God's love IS the Way of the Cross. It is in short God's *Via Dolorosa that saves us. To quote Ligouri in Station Eleven: My Jesus! loaded with contempt, nail my heart to Thy feet, that it may ever remain there, to love Thee, and never quit Thee again. I love Thee more than myself; I repent of having offended Thee. Never permit me to offend Thee again. Grant that I may love Thee always; and then do with me what Thou wilt.* 

Please consider joining us for Stations of the Cross on Sunday March 24th at 4pm to pray Saint Alfonsus Ligouiri's poetic and grace-filled devotionals. Lent is many things and perhaps this Lent, The Stations could be one of them for you, maybe for the first time. His mercy endures forever!


The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Here are three ways to grow as a Holy Family this week:

#### **SIGNS OF** REMEMBERANCE

One of the ways I am deepening Family Outreach Corner my faith during Lent this year is by reading Made for Heaven by

Fr. Agustino Torres. It is a book that guides me through prayer, journaling and meditation. I want to share an excerpt from the book with you that really struck me and has stayed with me.

So, maybe you're ready. You're all fired up to go into your Lenten wilderness and fast, giving up this or doing that. As we embark on this forty-day journey, let us remember the purpose behind our activity. Yes, we take on disciplines so it's easier for us to choose what is good. Ultimately though, we take on these practices so that we can better respond to God and the new life he gives us.

There's no more fundamental practice for Catholics than observing Sunday. It's the day Jesus rose from the dead, so the very first followers marked the day as special. It's the day that we set aside to enjoy the new things God is doing in our lives. So, while we focus on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving this Lent, we can't lose sight of what these disciples are intended to achieve within us. They are ways we can open ourselves more fully to God's love, which broke into our history in a way in Jesus's Resurrection. So, observing Sundays in a special way will keep all of our Lenten efforts grounded in this good news.

Forty days from now, we will enter Jerusalem with Jesus on Palm Sunday. We will enter in a mystical way the place where he shed his blood on the Cross, died, and rose again so that we can come to eternal life. What happened in history on a Sunday is to be lived within our hearts every day.

What does it mean to be called to be a person of the Resurrection? As you continue your Lenten practices, be sure to observe Sunday as a special day. Share a good meal with your family. Sit down at the table, set aside your phones, and spend time with one another. This is the intent of Sunday, of a holy day; to go to Mass and then to break bread with loved ones. Allow these "extra" days of Lent to become a joyful offering.

We have a long journey ahead. Sundays remind us of what we are striving for: new life in Christ.

Let's continue to pray for each other on our Lenten journeys.

## An invitation to ponder: **Cultivating Interior Silence:** The Silence of the Body

Last week, we considered what we usually think of in terms of

silence, speaking less or for a time, not at all. Over the next several weeks, we will explore other, less obvious kinds of silence that create within a space to be more attentive to God.

A "silence of the body" encourages us to "observe silence in the pace of our lives" (Fr. Basil Nortz, ORC, Holy Silence.) We have become very accustomed to rushing from one thing to the next. Our bodies often move faster than our souls, and when we arrive physically in a place, it can take a while before the rest of us catches up and we are able to be truly present there. There are good reasons to move quickly, but a lot of the time our rushing becomes an unhealthy habit based in our anxieties about missing out or disappointing others.

We can learn to live at God's pace for our lives, unhurried and attentive to him and those around us. The sacred gestures of the Mass are one way God teaches us. If you find yourself rushing through your movements at Mass, this would be a good place to start slowing down and seeking a more reverent pace. Take your time when making the sign of the cross and consider the love of God poured out there for you. Slow down your movements as you cross your forehead, lips, and heart before the reading of the Gospel; remember that God desires for his Word to dwell in your mind, upon your lips, and in your heart. Pause to pray for a few minutes after Mass to thank God for the great gift he has given you in the Eucharist. When we take our time with these things, it is one small way that we can show God our love for him. The "noise" of rushing around begins to fade, and we become more aware of

God's presence with us wherever we

are.

Let us remain together in the heart of Jesus, and pray for one another!

# Praying with Next Sunday's Gospel: Cleanses the Temple

Next Sunday, the Third Sunday of Lent, our Gospel text is John 2:13-25. Jesus is never afraid to confront evil in the world, whether that is demonic powers, the hypocrisy of the Pharisees, or money changers in the temple. This Gospel story's

confrontation is one of the more dramatic examples.

- Set aside 10-15 minutes to pray with the passage. Find it in your Bible or online at https:// bible.usccb.org/bible/readings/030324-YearB.cfm.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your time of prayer, spend a moment remembering how God always gazes upon you with love, and then read the passage slowly.
- How does Jesus' response to the money changers fit (or not) with your understanding of who he is? What does Jesus have to say about why he responds as he does? What would it be like to witness this scene? How would you respond to Jesus?
- Jesus expands his listeners' understanding of what the temple is. It is more than the building the Jewish people have worshiped in for centuries. Jesus, as God himself, is the temple. Have you ever had an experience of God expanding your understanding of something to see a new and deeper reality? Thank God for this greater insight and ask to receive more.
- Close by praying the Our Father.



# How to Go to Confession...

May the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of all the saints, whatever good you do and suffering you endure, heal your sins, help you grow in holiness, and reward you with eternal life.

Go in peace.

-Rite of Penance, no. 93

- 1 PREPARATION: Before going to confession, take some time to prepare. Begin with prayer, and reflect on your life since your last confession. How have you—in your thoughts, words, and actions—neglected to live Christ's commands to "love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Mt 22:37, 39)? As a help with this "examination of conscience," you might review the Ten Commandments or the Beatitudes (Ex 20:2-17; Dt 5:6-21; Mt 5:3-10; or Lk 6:20-26).
- 2 GREETING: The priest will welcome you; he may say a short blessing or read a Scripture passage.
- THE SIGN OF THE CROSS: Together, you and the priest will make the Sign of the Cross. You may then begin your confession with these or similar words: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been [give days, months, or years] since my last confession."
- 4 CONFESSION: Confess all your sins to the priest. If you are unsure what to say, ask the priest for help. When you are finished, conclude with these or similar words: "I am sorry for these and all my sins."
- 5 PENANCE: The priest will propose an act of penance. The penance might be prayer, a work of mercy, or an act of charity. He might also counsel you on how to better live a Christian life.

6 ACT OF CONTRITION: After the priest has conferred your penance, pray an Act of Contrition, expressing sorrow for your sins and resolving to sin no more. A suggested Act of Contrition is:

My God,
I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.
In choosing to do wrong
and failing to do good,
I have sinned against you
whom I should love above all things.
I firmly intend, with your help,
to do penance,
to sin no more,
and to avoid whatever leads me to sin.
Our Savior Jesus Christ
suffered and died for us.
In his name, my God, have mercy.

(Rite of Penance, no. 45)

- 7 ABSOLUTION: The priest will extend his hands over your head and pronounce the words of absolution. You respond, "Amen."
- 8 PRAISE: The priest will usually praise the mercy of God and will invite you to do the same. For example, the priest may say, "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good." And your response would be, "His mercy endures for ever" (Rite of Penance, no. 47).
- DISMISSAL: The priest will conclude the sacrament, often saying, "Go in peace."

f it has been a while since your last confession, remember, "Do not fear" (Is 41:10). The priest will help guide you. And feel free to take this how-to guide with you! (For more information, visit www.usccb.org/confession.)


