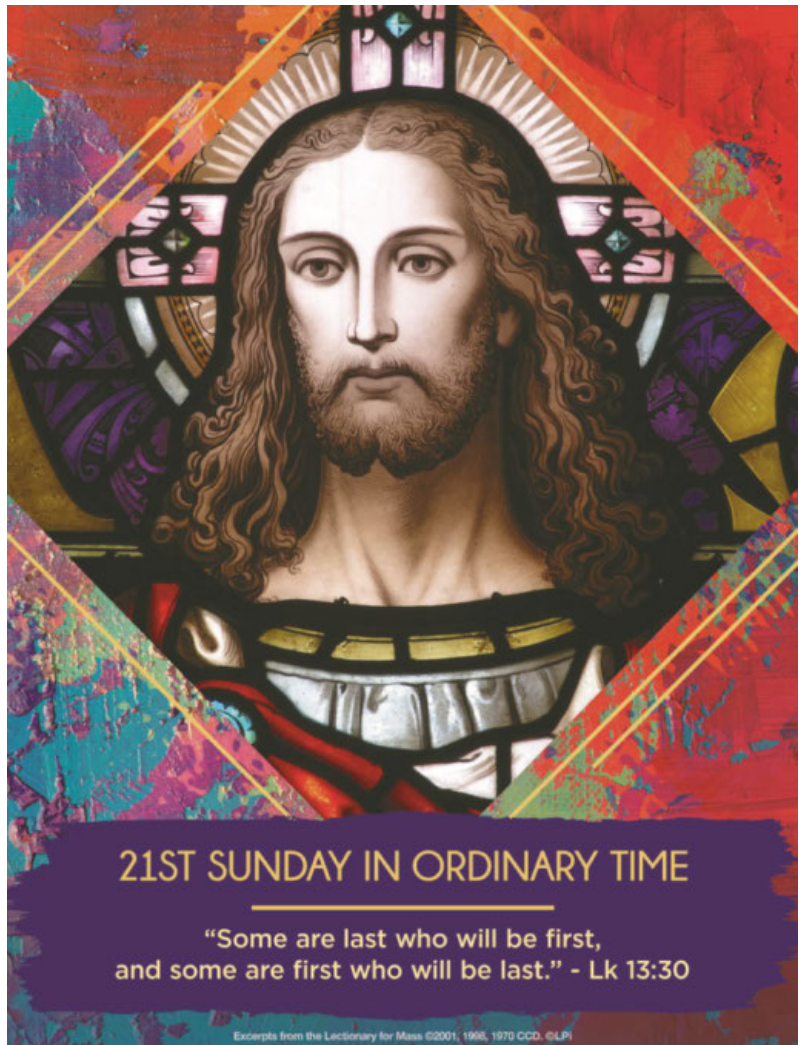

Discipline and the Narrow Gate

"My son, do not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reprov'd by him; for whom the Lord loves, he disciplines; he scourges every son he acknowledges."

Endure your trials as discipline" Hebrews 12:5-7a

Jesus uses the metaphor of a narrow gate to represent the way to salvation, highlighting its exclusivity and the personal effort and discipline required to enter. Many will try to enter but won't be able, indicating that simply knowing about Jesus or engaging in religious practices is not enough.

The **"narrowness"** is not about physical size but rather the **singular path of faith in Jesus**.

Luke's Gospel today emphasizes the urgency of seeking salvation, as the door will eventually be shut. Jesus warns against complacency and procrastination, urging people to make a decisive choice for the narrow gate.

Each individual is responsible for their own decision and must actively strive and discipline themselves to enter through the narrow gate.

True faith requires more than just intellectual knowledge or external religious activities. **It demands a heart that is humble, repentant, and willing to follow Jesus's teachings.** Those who rely on past associations with Christ or religious rituals without genuine faith will be rejected.

Jesus highlights the possibility of being excluded from the kingdom of God, even after claiming to know Him. **Jesus's response to those who are excluded is "I do not know you," indicating a lack of genuine relationship.** This exclusion is not due to God's arbitrary judgment but because they did not prepare or discipline themselves to strive for the narrow gate.

Prayer of Discipline: *Creator Father, we know through Jesus that despite the narrowness of the gate, the invitation to salvation is open to all, regardless of background or past. The message is inclusive, extending to people from all nations. Jesus's love and grace are available to those who surrender, discipline and humble themselves to trust exclusively in Him . Amen.*

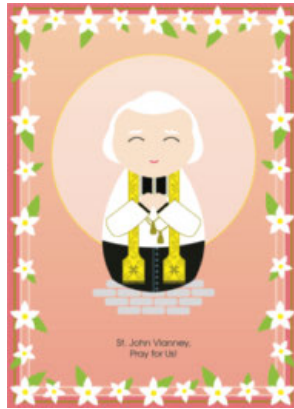

The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Queenship of Mary is a title given to Mary, the mother of Jesus. It means that Mary is honored as a queen because of her special role in God's plan. This title recognizes her important place in the Church and in the lives of believers.

The Bible and the Church's tradition tell us about Mary's special role. She is seen as a loving mother and caring queen. This helps us understand how she guides and protects us, like a queen would care for her people.

The Church celebrates the Queenship of Mary with a special feast day. This day reminds us to honor Mary and to ask for her help. It is a time to remember her kindness and love for everyone. In the early centuries, Church Fathers like St. Ephrem and St. Ambrose wrote about Mary. They spoke of her as a powerful intercessor and a model for all Christians. The idea of Mary as a queen started to develop. They saw her as someone with a special connection to Jesus, the King of Kings.

In the 16th century, devotion to Mary grew even more. People started to pray the Rosary and celebrate special feasts for her. The Church officially recognized many of these devotions. This helped to spread the idea of Mary as queen even further. Saints like St. Bernard of Clairvaux and St. Alphonsus Liguori wrote about her Queenship, strengthening the belief among the faithful.

In 1954, Pope Pius XII declared the feast of the Queenship of Mary. This was an important moment in the Church's history. The Pope explained that Mary is Queen because of her special role as the Mother of God. He encouraged Catholics to honor her as their heavenly Queen and to seek her intercession.



Today, the Church continues to honor Mary as Queen. Her Queenship is a reminder of her special place in the Church and in the lives of the faithful. It shows that she is always ready to help us and bring us closer to Jesus.

Our Jubilee Year of Hope Guest Speaker Series next welcomes **St. Gianna Clinic**.

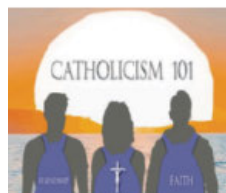

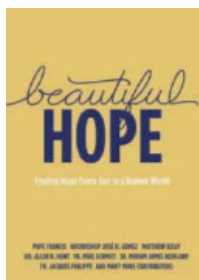

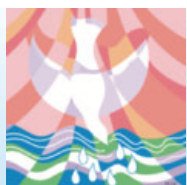


Beautiful Hope Book Discussion

Our Afghan Neighbors

As we consider the theme of bringing God's hope to the immigrant, one thing that can help us is getting to know their stories. The weekend of September 6-7, we welcome a traveling exhibit to St. Raphael that features the stories of eight Afghan refugees.

"World Relief Fox Valley and the History Museum at the Castle (in Appleton) partnered to make the exhibition possible. Staff from World Relief and the History Museum worked together conducting oral history interviews with

eight Afghans. Their stories and chilling accounts of escaping Afghanistan are the basis for the personal exhibition. The Afghans interviewed for the exhibit challenged the stereotypical image of Afghanistan depicted in the news. *Our Afghan Neighbors also shows the connections between local, national, and international history.*" (From the History Museum at the Castle website)
