Dear Parishioners.

The Church is missionary at its core. Just before returning to heaven 40 days after Easter, Jesus gave the Church a mission to "go and make disciples."

The Catholic Church in the United States sent many sisters and priests as missionaries to various parts of the world in the 20th century. Since 1963, our Diocese of Green Bay has had a mission in the Dominican Republic. St. Raphael has sent numerous medical and service mission teams there over the years.

What has changed in more recent decades is that the Church in other parts of the world, especially Africa and parts of Asia, have nurtured vocations to the priesthood and religious life and now are able to care for their people on their own. Meanwhile in many parts of the United States and Europe the number of religious vocations has declined in recent decades.

Since 2010, Bishop Ricken has welcomed priests from other countries to serve the people of our parishes. About a third of the priests serving in our diocese today are from other countries. Fr. Louis, who has served St. Jude Parish since 2018, is an example. He and the other priests are wonderful missionaries to us.

Each summer we have the Missionary Cooperation Plan appeal. We learn about missionary efforts in other countries. Each diocese and religious order that sends priests to our diocese participates. This weekend we hear from Fr. Louis about his own diocese in India, and how we can help. As we receive the spiritual leadership of Fr. Louis and other international priests, we can support those back in their homelands through our prayers and financial support.

Thank you for your support of this appeal as our way in participating in the mission of the Church throughout the world.

Welcome, Fr. Louis Golamari Mission Cause: Archdiocese of Hyderabad, INDIA

Evangelization and Mission Extension: The Mission Archdiocese of Hyderabad continues to grow despite

challenges from an anti-Christian government. While actively converting people to Catholicism, many new mission areas lack proper worship spaces, and social issues like poverty, illiteracy, and inadequate healthcare affect the local Christian population.

Education and Protection of Child Rights: We aim to educate 700 poor children annually who are at risk of child marriages and child labor due to poverty. By providing tuition assistance, uniforms, books, and school supplies, we ensure these children receive the education they deserve.

Care for the Aged and Widows: We offer support to the rural poor, including the elderly and orphans, through low-cost health services and awareness programs to improve their access to healthcare and wellbeing.

Women Empowerment Training: Our program assists 1,000 economically disadvantaged women, mainly single mothers, by providing training in skills like sewing and beauty therapy and essential start-up kits to promote self-sufficiency and empowerment.

Climate Resilient-Cum-Adoptive Farming: This initiative focuses on aiding smallholder farmers facing economic and climate challenges. By implementing sustainable farming practices in 10 villages, we aim to improve their livelihoods and reduce the risk of crop loss and debt.

Lord, I pray for my (child/grandchild). I pray that you would prepare a path for (him/her) this school year.






Divorce Support


