

Dear Parishioners,

Don't you just love a good redemption story? There is something about stories like Les Miserables and The Count of Monte Cristo that are so satisfying and inspiring. Of course, the greatest redemption story in history is that of Jesus Christ, who died to save us. St. Paul's Letter to Philemon (our second reading this Sunday) beautifully mirrors the salvation offered in Christ. Let's investigate.

The letter has 3 main characters: St. Paul, a runaway slave named Onesimus, and Onesimus's master. St. Paul, in prison (literally) for Christ, meets Onesimus during his imprisonment. In their conversations, St. Paul wins Onesimus for Christ. So, Onesimus returns to his master with this letter, no longer a slave to sin, but truly set free in Christ. Onesimus and his "master" now share One Master, the Christ. They are "brothers" in the Lord and St. Paul encourages the recipient of the letter to treat Onesimus as such. They share a freedom in Christ Jesus

that is so much deeper than the exchange of services.

May this brief letter from St. Paul remind us that our bond as sons and daughters of the Father is far deeper than anything that might separate us by worldly standards.

Heavenly Hero for September: St. Teresa of Calcutta

Born: August 26, 1910 Died: September 5, 1997 Feast Day: September 5

Patronage: World Youth Day, Missionaries of Charity, and the Archdiocese of Calcutta Mother Teresa, also known as Saint Teresa of Calcutta, was born in a city called Skpoje, located in present day Albania. Her parents called her Agnes. When Agnes was just twelve, she realized God was calling her to become a missionary. At the age of eighteen,

Agnes joined the Sisters of Loreto and became a missionary with the Sisters of Loreto in India.

Sister Teresa was transferred to the convent school in Calcutta. She taught there for almost twenty years. She was very saddened by the poverty in India. On September 10, 1946, Sister Teresa experienced "the call within the call." She describes the experience in the following way, "I was to leave the convent and help the poor while living among them."

In 1948, Teresa donned a cotton sari (traditional Indian garb) with a blue border. Armed with an Indian citizen and basic medical training, Teresa ventured into the slums. She founded a school and began caring for the poor and the hungry. Women began joining her in her work in 1949. Teresa then began formulating the groundwork for a new religious community dedicated to serving "the poorest of the poor." This community became known as the Missionaries of Charity.

Mother Teresa served as superior general of the Missionaries of Charity from 1950 until her death in 1997. Each member makes the customary vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience and to give wholehearted free service to the poorest of the poor. At the time of Mother Teresa's death, the Missionaries of Charity had grown to more than 4,000 sisters and 300 brothers working at 610 missions in more than 123 countries. She was canonized by Pope Francis in 2016.


Talking Point with Children: St. Teresa of Calcutta reminds us that when we do small things with great love we can make a difference in the world. Her witness impacted countless lives and she inspired many others to answer Jesus' call to serve the least of these through acts of mercy and love.

Action Step for Children: Perform small acts of kindness: Challenge each family member to do "small things with great love." This could be as simple as smiling at a stranger, helping a sibling with a chore, or sharing a toy.

Got Rhythm?

The beginning of the school year brings a lot of change to family life. I have a friend who is sending her oldest off to college, my niece walked her son to kindergarten for the first time. These times make us aware of the rhythm of life.

In past generations people's lives followed the rhythms of nature more closely. In Autumn people prepared for winter. Winter came and life slowed down. People rested, reflected and rejuvenated. With spring came the work of preparing soil, planting seeds and pruning away unnecessary deadwood. In summer, people tended to what had been sown. The season included long days of hard work, but also, days of celebration with family and friends.

For a lot of parents, these seasonal rhythms have been replaced. Maybe by sports seasons of football and soccer, basketball and volleyball, baseball and more soccer. Or by the consumer buying seasons: back-to-school sales. Halloween candy, costumes and decorations, followed by Thanksgiving, then Christmas shopping, after-Christmas sales, Valentines Day, Easter and Fourth of July. Yet, these new cadences of life offer little or no down time. It's all go, go, go!

How do we get off this merry-go-round? Just jump off? Is it possible to slow down a bit and then step off? Rhythm is such an essential part of nature, it must be important in our lives. How can we be more intentional about establishing rhythm nowadays?

Start small. Maybe night or morning prayer is already a habit; add two minutes at noon or before dinner. Use the family Bible to read a psalm or chapter from the Gospels or sit quietly for five minutes concentrating on the rhythm of your own breathing. As you get in the rhythm, you may find you want to increase the amount of prayer, or the number of times.



Establishing a regular pattern of prayer fertilizes the soil so other life-giving rhythms can take root!

Our Jubilee Year of Hope Guest Speaker Series welcomes St. Gianna Clinic.




