

Beating the Clock

Personal Productivity and Time Management

There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under the heavens. ~Ecclesiastes 3:1

In the area of time management parents need to be flexible, because ultimately in serving our families and our God, things may not always go according to our to-do list or personal agenda. I can remember when I had my first child as a first time mom, accomplishing something as simple as a shower felt like a major effort. Nowadays, in my work here at the parish, I still juggle meetings, lesson planning, writing this column, etc. around the top priority in my life: my family.

I have learned to be accepting of God's place in my plans and the need to listen to the quiet rumblings of His desires for my days. I have learned that sometimes simplification is in order and that the deadlines I make for myself can be shifted within reason. Most importantly, I have learned that the most critical part of managing my time is creating the space I need everyday to spend time in prayer and in service of my family. Ultimately, if those two agenda items have been met with a happy heart, the rest is bound to fall into place in God's good time.

Your own brand of personal productivity will vary depending upon your unique set of life circumstances. Here are some questions you can reflect on, read the questions taking time to reflect on what it means to you to be a productive steward of the time God has given you each day:

- When, during the course of the day, do you spend time talking with God in prayer?
- What are your own goals for how you want and need to spend each day?
- What are your priorities in life today and long-term?
- Do you feel a balance in life between your work, your service to your family, your care of your physical body, and your spiritual life?
- Do you have the ability to simplify your load, freeing up any responsibilities you have taken on to make more time for existing priorities?

Emptiness & Abundance



They say there are two kinds of people in this world – the kind that fills up their gas tank when they have a quarter tank left and the kind that waits until empty. I fall into the first camp, but a couple of my closest friends fall into the second. On more than one occasion when they graciously allowed me to drive their cars, I have started the car only to find myself staring at the gas light. They always claim that they know how far they can push their cars before they really need to fill up. But since I lack this special ability to know how much gas is left in their tank when

the sensor says it's running on fumes, I tend to find myself praying I will make it to a gas station before the car comes to a halt.

Whatever camp we fall into when it comes to how far to push things before stopping for gas, I think we might agree that having a full tank is preferable to an empty one. Abundance is a concept that feels naturally joyful and alive. Emptiness is more likely a state of being that we would prefer to avoid. Over the next few weeks, I'd like to offer a few reflections about the place of emptiness and abundance in our spiritual lives. Could there be anything good about emptiness? Is there a connection between emptiness and abundance? How might God be present to us when it feels like we are running on fumes and have very little to give?



I hope you join me for the ride. I promise not to leave you with the gas light on.

Let us remain in the heart of Jesus and pray for one another!


