Dear Parishioners of **St. Raphael the Archangel Parish**,

One of the great joys of attending daily Mass is that you get immersed in the full liturgical calendar of the Church. A daily Mass attendee really feels the ebbs and flows of the liturgical feasts and seasons. Attending daily Mass makes being Catholic feel like less of a “just on Sunday” thing and more of a “my whole life” thing. It gives one the privilege of the *continual reading of several books of the bible* (e.g. *we have been plodding through the Gospel of Luke the last several weeks and we will take on St. Paul’s letter to the Romans throughout October*). Also, *attending daily Mass gives one the chance to learn about many saints whose feasts are celebrated throughout the year.*

September 29 is the Feast of the Archangels and therefore OUR PATRONAL FEAST DAY! Most people would have to attend daily Mass to celebrate this Feast. That said, since St. Raphael the Archangel is our patron saint, we get to replace this Ordinary time Sunday with our feast and celebrate with *even greater solemnity. Every Sunday ought to look a bit different for Catholics. That said, today in particular, the Solemnity of our Archangel, should be marked with great celebration. Spend some time with family, go out for ice cream, and/or enjoy a beverage of your responsible choosing. Marking these kinds of high feast days in the Church can go a long way in helping you to notice the change in liturgical season whether you attend daily Mass or not.*

Why do we as Catholics celebrate feast days?

We celebrate feast days to honor saints and to commemorate important events in the life of Jesus, Mary, and the Church. These celebrations are meant to inspire us, teach us about holy lives, and draw us closer to God through prayer, remembrance, and community.

What is the purpose of Catholic feast days? To honor holy figures and ask for their intercession. Most feast days are dedicated to saints, who are seen as “spiritual relatives” and models of holiness. We believe saints are in heaven and can pray for people on earth.

The date chosen for a saint’s feast day is often the day of their death, which the Church considers their “heavenly Birthday” because it marks their entry into eternal life. When celebrating feast days, we venerate saints for their heroic virtues but reserve worship for God alone.

The saints provide tangible examples of how to live a virtuous Christian life. Reflecting on their stories offers guidance and inspires Catholics in their own faith journeys.

Feast days are an opportunity for us to gather as a community for Mass, processions, and other festivities. This strengthens our sense of belonging to the “communion of saints” which includes both believers on earth and those in heaven.

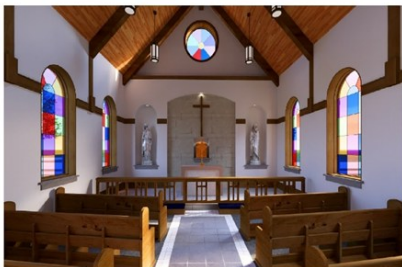
St. Raphael holds a special place for us since he is the patron saint of our parish. He is one of the seven patron saints who stands before the throne of the Lord. Raphael’s name means “God heals”. He is also the patron saint of the blind, happy meetings, nurses, physicians and travelers.

St. Carlo Acutis Adoration Chapel



Groundbreaking for a new adoration chapel for the Oshkosh Catholic community will be Sunday, September 28 at 12:30 pm at the Sacred Heart site of St. Jude Parish. When completed, the adoration chapel will move from St. Mary Church (Most Blessed Sacrament Parish) to Sacred Heart (St. Jude Parish). All are welcome at the groundbreaking ceremony.

The chapel is built on the location of the former Sacred Heart School, which was recently taken down. Bricks and items from the school are being

used to build the chapel. Bishop Ricken has given the chapel the name St. Carlo Acutis Adoration Chapel.

The Chapel, which will be owned by St. Jude Parish, will be for all the Catholics of our area. St. Jude is paying the cost of the chapel, which is about \$1 million. St. Jude is also paying several hundred thousand dollars more for the demolition of the school, and for a parking lot and landscaping for the new chapel. There is no capital campaign to raise money for this project, though donations are welcome and appreciated.

St. Raphael Parish, with the approval of the Parish Council and Finance Council, will donate \$100,000 towards the new chapel. This money will come from reserves saved from prior years and investment earnings. If parishioners would like to donate, you may donate to St. Raphael and mark your gift for the Adoration Chapel. We will forward those gifts to St. Jude Parish.

We continue to seek people who are willing to commit to adoring the Lord for a set hour every week. If you are interested, contact Kathie Reed at 920-539-6871.



The Empty Jar & Jug

Have you ever experienced a time when it seemed like you had run out of everything you needed? For whatever reason (job loss, unexpected bills, illness, etc.), we sometimes find ourselves staring into the void and wondering how we will make ends meet.

Elijah and the widow of Zarephath face an extreme version of this situation. Their story is recorded in the Old Testament in I Kings 17. During a time of severe famine, Elijah has no food. The Lord sends him to the town of Zarephath to find a

widow who will provide for his needs. The only problem is that this widow has only a handful of flour left in her jar and a little oil in her jug. She had been planning to empty them to make one last, little meal for her and her son, expecting that starvation would soon follow.

In the midst of her destitution, Elijah makes an audacious request: "Don't be afraid. Go home and do as you have said. But first make a small loaf of bread for me from what you have and bring it to me, and then make something for yourself and your son." She has almost nothing left – and he asks her to feed him first (!), then herself and her son.

Elijah then gives the widow a promise from the Lord: "For this is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'The jar of flour will not be used up and the jug of oil will not run dry until the day the LORD sends rain on the land.'"

Would we, in that moment, have had the faith to feed a stranger and hope that God would make good on his promise? In my last article, I pointed out that coming to the end of ourselves can be a great gift. This widow clearly has reached the limits of what she can do. She has almost nothing left. In faith, she does as Elijah says, and until the famine ends, there is always enough flour and oil to feed Elijah, her son, and herself. All three are sustained because of her faith. She trusts that God will provide as he promised – and he does!

What would it look like for us to have such faith when we come to the end of ourselves and our resources? If you have experienced this, how did it change you?



Lord, help us to offer to you what little we have and trust that you will multiply it to meet our needs.

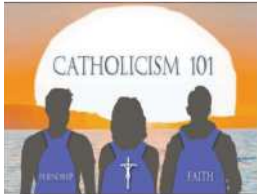
