

Dear Parishioners,

Recently Bishop Ricken appointed me to be the Chair of the Priest Personnel Board. This is a committee that works to help Bishop make priest assignments. I will remain at St. Raphael as Pastor. While it will involve some additional time and work, it will not change my role here.

In the Catholic Church the bishop of the diocese makes the appointments of priests. Here in the Diocese of Green Bay, most appointments take effect on or around July 1 of each year. The work of the Priest Personnel Board is to survey the priests to get input from them, to determine where there will be a need for a new priest, and to learn about the need of parishes that will receive a new priest. It involves looking at parishes that need Spanish-speaking priests, parishes that would be good for recently ordained priests, and helping priests from other countries and the parishes that they serve here. The work usually begins this time of year and a lot is done in January, February and March. Bishop has been making the appointments shortly after Easter, to take effect July 1.

We have 157 parishes in our diocese. As of 2024, we had 63 active diocesan priests to serve those parishes. There are also 13 priests from religious orders who serve in parishes and almost 30 priests from other countries who serve on a temporary basis, usually 10 years. This means there are about 106 priests to serve our parishes and diocesan offices.

One priest serves the UWO Newman Center, one serves as Vicar General, one serves as Vicar for Clergy and two priests, including **Fr. Kevin Ripley**, serve as vocation directors. There also are a number of deacons who serve parishes, as Deacon Paul Vidmar does in Omro and Winneconne, with either a retired priest or priests like me and Fr. Ben who celebrate the Masses.





As you compare those numbers, you see that we need more priests! Please pray for vocations from our parish and from our families. Please pray for our seminarian, **Olivier Nndorimana**, as he continues his formation at St. Francis de Sales Seminary in

Milwaukee. Please pray for Father Kevin and others who help form our seminarians. Please pray for **Father Ben** in his role as Chaplain of Lourdes High School. That role is funded by the Vocations Office of the Diocese so that Father Ben has the time to be with our high school students at Lourdes. Father Ben also directs our Confirmation program at the parish, where he can interact with students from our public schools as well.

October 12 is the feast day of our new saint, St. Carlo Acutis. If he had not died on this day (Oct 12) in 2006 at the age of 15, he may well be a priest today. Let us ask his intercession for more young people to come to know Jesus in the Eucharist and be willing to give their lives in service as priests and sisters. **Saint Carlo Acutis**, pray for us.




Children's Liturgy of the Word is in need of leaders.

The Empty Lunch Box



"When Jesus looked up and saw a great crowd coming toward him, he said to Philip, 'Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?' He asked this only to test him, for he already had in mind what he was going to do.

"Philip answered him, 'It would take more than half a year's wages to buy enough bread for each one to have a bite!'

"Another of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, spoke up, 'Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many?" (John 6:5-9)

When the boy in this story from the Gospel of John left home that morning, it is safe to say he never could have imagined how his day would unfold. I can't imagine that he packed his lunch (or watched his mom packing it) and thought, "I wonder how many people that could feed." As a growing boy, he probably just hoped it would be enough for him.

As his day unfolds, he finds himself in the most unusual of circumstances, part of the crowd that had gathered around the itinerant rabbi and miracle worker. Jesus Jesus notices that the crowd is hungry, and the boy. maybe surprising even himself, offers his lunch. His act of generosity might look foolish to many. After all, Andrew has a point, "How far will his five small loaves of bread and two small fish go among so many?" But something stirs his heart to empty his lunch box. His act of faith sets a miracle in motion. Not only does the crowd of 5,000 men (not counting women and children) eat "as much as they wanted," but there is an abundance left over, 12 full baskets. Jesus makes it clear that he can do a lot with very little.

Often I feel like I have so little to offer the Lord. When I look at the needs and hungers of our world, what are my few loaves and fish? Surely not enough to feed so great a crowd! Jesus continually reminds me that my only concern is to give him whatever little I have and to trust that he can turn not much at all into abundance. Let us have the faith of the boy in this story and share all with Jesus.
