



As friends and followers of Jesus, we are devoted to fostering households and communities of discipleship through the mission and ministry of the Catholic Church.




#### Dear Parishioners.

St. Therese of Lisieux entered the Carmelite Monastery in 1888 when she was only 15 years old. She died nine years later at the age of 24. During her nine years in the cloistered monastery, she saw and interacted with no one but her fellow Carmelite nuns. Despite her limited contact with the world outside her community, St. Therese of Lisieux is the patron saint of missions. How can that possibly be?

On World Mission Sunday we take up a collection to support missionary efforts in areas of the world where the Church is young, struggling, or persecuted. How come? Because in these places, there are human persons who do not know the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Salvation only comes through Christ: There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved (Acts 4:12). The missionaries need our help!

St. Therese of Lisieux understood this fact, and had a burning zeal for all men to be saved. Jesus called her then to a particular missionary role even from within her monastery. She wrote about it in her autobiography: "You are my praying Moses on the mountain; request workers of me, and I will send them. I only wait for a prayer, a sigh of your heart! The apostolate of prayer, is it not so to say, higher than that of preaching? Our mission, as Carmelite, is one of forming evangelical workers that will save millions of souls whose mothers we will be" (Story of a Soul).

This World Mission Sunday, allow St. Therese of Lisieux to inspire you to mission. Pray for more missionaries. Pray for those already dedicating themselves to preaching the Gospel in mission territory. Keep your arms raised in prayer like Moses and you too can be a great help in the evangelization of the world.

## World Mission Sunday October 18/19, 2025

This weekend, October 18/19 we are called in a special way to be "missionaries of faith." We can be those missionaries through prayer and participation in the Eucharist, and by giving generously to the World Mission Sunday collection.

In the Diocese of Green Bay, the World Mission Collection supports the activities of three mission collections: the Society for the Propagation of the Faith; the Collection for Latin America; and the Collection to Aid the Church in Central and Eastern Europe.

The Propagation of the Faith provides ongoing support for the pastoral and evangelizing programs of the Catholic Church in Africa, Asia, the Islands of the Pacific and remote regions of Latin America. This includes aid for the education and support of seminarians, religious novices, and lay catechists; for the work of religious communities in education, health care and social services; for communication and transportation needs, and for disaster and emergency relief when necessary.

On World Mission Sunday, you are asked for your prayers and financial assistance in supporting the missionary work of the Church. 




#### **Infant Baptism**

Infants accept the faith through the faith of their parents. Our parish offers group sessions to prepare parents for the baptism ceremony and for leading their children in a life of faith. Sessions are held twice per month, all year round. It may be easier to participate in a session before the child is born. There should not be more than two godparents. A non-Catholic Christian may serve as a Christian witness in addition to the Catholic godparent.

#### GIVING CHILDREN THE GIFT OF FEELING ENOUGH (PART 1)

When my daughter, Kailyn was in first grade, she came home from school and put her lunch box on the counter with a loud thud. She came over to me and said, "From now on I want my lunch packed in a brown paper bag. I figured there was more to the story of why she didn't want to use her Barney (the purple dinosaur) lunch box. She had used it all through kindergarten and said she wanted to continue with it into the next arade.

I asked her why she wanted a brown bag instead, she sighed and it all came tumbling out. It seems one of the girls at the lunch table said, very loudly, "You like Barney? He's for babies!"

My first reaction was to storm into the lunchroom the next day and defend my child. I wanted to walk over to the girls at the table and let them know that she can carry any kind of lunch box she likes! Of course I didn't do that, I didn't overreact either. I just took a deep breath and said that she could continue to use her Barney lunchbox and not listen to her classmate and that she didn't have to listen to what others say about what she likes.

Fortunately, as Kailyn grew older, she began to figure out what voices mattered. It wasn't always easy. But she learned how to tune out the negativity. In an age when social media is so prevalent, it's hard for young people to find and listen to positive voices. It requires a lot of work to deflect ads, posts, and random comments. But it is possible.

Family life can nurture the skills needed for growth and ignoring negative voices. It can offer a safe place and be the place of positive voices. Families can encourage and give to each other the gift of being enough. When a child, or even an adult, has a sense of being loved and enough, life is easier. It becomes easier to figure out what voices matter. Family members will have computers and cell phones. Most young people stay connected through some kind of social media. Isolation is not a viable answer for most.

Parents can stress to their children that they are more than the number of likes on a social media post. Parents can provide good voices via music, books and family members.

#### The Empty Water Jar

The story of Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman, told in John 4, has many interesting details. Writers of the ancient world did not waste words, and so we can know that each of these details is important to our understanding of the text.

The detail I'd like to focus on today is this short line: "Then, leaving her water jar, the woman went back to the town."

The story begins with the Samaritan woman carrying that same jar in the noonday heat to draw water from the well. The other women of the town would have chosen a cooler time of day for this laborious task, but she avoids their company and comes to the well when she expects to be alone. Her actions suggest she is the town outcast, looked down upon by others for her string of failed marriages and for now living with a man who is not her husband.

Today, however, she is not alone at the well. Someone has been waiting for her. Jesus has gone out of his way to encounter her there, and a conversation unfolds between the two of them that will change her life. Jesus promises her living water, and she comes to understand that the thirst he wants to guench is far deeper than her physical need for water. He wants to meet the deepest thirst of her heart – the thirst unsatisfied by all the men he knows she has turned to in her longing to be known and loved.

At the close of their encounter, she leaves her water jar and returns to the town to tell everyone, "Come, see a man who told me everything I ever did. Could this be the Messiah?" The first surprise in her response is that she seems to forget her initial purpose. She comes with an empty water jar and leaves it empty beside the well. Her thirsty heart truly has been filled with so much love that she forgets about her physical thirst. The empty jar has been forgotten because her heart is full.

The second surprise is that this woman, who has avoided the company of others, rushes back to her town to tell everyone about Jesus. Her shame has been washed away by the one who truly sees, knows, and loves her as she is. She is so overcome by the goodness of Jesus that she forgets not only her empty water jar but also all fears and hesitations. She wants everyone to know this man who must be the Messiah.



How is Jesus offering living water to you today? What empty water jar will you leave behind? And is there anyone you want to share his goodness with?

Let us remain together in the heart of Jesus and pray for one another!





#### New pricing will be:




