

The Month Of The Holy Rosary

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and this is a reminder of the promises for those who pray this contemplative prayer with Our Lady. It is a sign of predestination.

"Jesus addressed this parable.."Two people went up to the temple area to pray.."" (Luke 18:9,10)

Dear Parishioners,

Many of us appreciate having a morning routine. Spending so much of my time outdoors, checking the current and forecasted weather is part of my routine. The literal barometer indicates both how things are and will be for me. Perhaps this is also part of your routine.

Many of us also make prayer an essential part of our morning routine. The Gospel readings for both this and last weekend remind us the importance of prayer. Our God desires a relationship with us, for indeed, He is a relationship: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. As do the relationships we have with one another, our relationship with God grows through communication. Prayer.

This may be a good time to examine our prayer lives, to check a figurative "barometer." In our Gospel reading from last weekend, Jesus encourages us to pray always and often. Are we praying intentionally during time set aside for a relationship with God? Do we find ourselves in conversation with Him throughout the day in moments of joy or sadness? Do we ask Him for strength and guidance in times of need?

Another indication of the condition of our prayer lives is if our prayer is honest and sincere. In our Gospel reading this weekend the Pharisee "spoke this prayer to himself." His words were self-serving and judgmental, not an experience of a lived relationship with God. In contrast the tax collector prayed "O God, be merciful to me a sinner." He prayed humbly, vulnerably and his prayers were heard in a conversation with God. How do we pray? Are our words simply spoken? Or are they an intentional, sincere conversation with a God who knows us better than we know ourselves and yet desires to hear us share with Him?

As we go forth this week, let us take a moment to check the barometer of our prayer life. Do we pray often? Do we pray sincerely as part of a relationship with our God who loves us?

Let us pray: "Loving God, thank you. Thank you for creating us to be in a loving relationship with You.

Through prayer we ask that you draw us deeper into your loving arms. May we go forth to proclaim and share your love with others. Amen."





OF FEELING ENOUGH (PART 2)

Wavs to Foster the Positive for Children

Offer quiet

In an age of constant dings and screens, try to find quiet time. Ride in the car without the radio. Shut off the Wi-Fi for a few hours. Go to a church and spend time with Jesus. Go for a hike and enjoy God's creation.

Affirm, affirm, affirm.

Remember to stay positive with children. That doesn't mean that you should approve of everything your children do, but it means treating them with kindness and understanding. Children need the most love when they are at their most unlovable.

Be Present to others.

Invite your children to write a note to a relative or a parish member

Stress Kindness.

Encourage family members to participate in charitable acts.

Say nighttime prayers or sit and talk with your child(ren).

Things come tumbling out when our kids are talking to God. Teach them to reflect on their day and then talk about the next. Have honest conversations with your children about what they are experiencing each day.

Look to the Saints.

Listen to Saint Francis de Sales, "Be who you are, and be that perfectly well." Introduce children to the stories of the saints who took a different path that, at times, might not have been easy.

It isn't easy to feel enough all the time. It is hard to grow up in such an ever-changing world. But with an affirming and loving family, children have a great start.

The Empty Womb



Over the last several weeks, we have been considering the themes of emptiness and abundance. On this last weekend of the month of the Rosary, we look to Mary as a prime example to confirm our theme - that God enters with great abundance into the empty places we offer to him.

Luke's Gospel records the story that we know as the First Joyful Mystery of the Rosary: the Annunciation. The archangel Gabriel is sent by God with the greatest

proposal of all time. Will Mary say "yes" to becoming the Mother of God? Will she consent to her empty womb becoming the first home on earth for the Son of God? Mary is astounded that such a great and seemingly impossible request is made of her, and in her humility wonders how it can be. "With God, nothing is impossible" is the angel's reply.

The Holy Spirit's overshadowing of Mary to bring life to her virgin womb is a singular grace and event in the history of our world. But a similar invitation is offered to us. Will we empty our hearts of all that is not of God and open them to receive his Spirit? Will we say yes to his proposal to breathe new life into us? Will we accept the abundance of his Divine Life dwelling within us?

We all receive this gift of the indwelling Holy Spirit in our baptism, but have we "unpacked" it? The Spirit is always with us, but do we notice? One simple prayer can help us pay closer attention: "Come, Holy Spirit." Try praying this simple prayer a few times before you begin something – your day, your time of prayer, a new project at work, a conversation. And then look for the ways the Spirit is present with you, offering a more abundant life in that particular moment, the only kind of life that truly satisfies our empty hearts.



Let us remain together in the heart of Jesus and pray for one another!




