

Let Christ Mold Us into His Likeness

"Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute." Luke 21:14-15



Dear Parishioners,

Pope Leo XIV recently touched upon the fact that we need to make sure our religious faith transforms all of our life. For example, how we behave on Sunday morning should not be different than how we behave during the rest of the week. We can't be Christians on Sunday and pagans the rest of the week.

Some religious folks may feel very safe and secure because of their religious devotion. But Pope Leo says we should take care. Just because we have religious habits, traditions, or practices, we can't get comfortable.

Pope Leo says: "While we may sometimes be judgmental towards those distant from the faith, Jesus calls into question "the security of believers." He tells us that it is not enough to profess the faith with words, to eat and drink with him by celebrating the Eucharist or to have a good knowledge of Christian doctrine. **Our faith is authentic when it embraces our whole life**, when it becomes a criterion for our decisions, when it makes us women and men committed to doing what is right and who take risks out of love, even as Jesus did.

There are times when this involves making difficult and unpopular decisions, resisting our selfish inclinations, placing ourselves at the service of others, and persevering in doing what is right when the logic of evil seems to prevail, and so on. Once we cross that threshold, however, we will discover that life flourishes anew. From that moment on, we will enter into the immense heart of God and the joy of the eternal banquet that he has prepared for us." (Pope Leo XIV August 24th. 2025)

This week, what difficult decision may I need to make to begin to live a better Christian life?

Prayer of Surrender: Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty, My memory, my understanding And my entire will, All I have and call my own. You have given all to me. To you, Lord, I return it. Everything is yours; do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace.

CATHOLICS AND SAINTS

The true relationship between Catholics and our saints is very important. Non-Catholic friends who haven't been catechized in our faith may look at the statues of Mary that we have in our yards and homes, or the holy cards of saints which we collect, with confusion. They may enter our churches, many named for saints, and view elaborate paintings or stained-glass windows depicting their lives and assume that we are worshipping the subjects of the artwork or engaging in idolatry.

The truth of the matter is that we Catholics don't pray to saints, but we pray with them. In a moment of crisis, you may turn to a trusted friend and ask for prayers on your behalf. The Catholic Church teaches us that since the saints dwell in heaven, they may intercede with God the Father on our behalf. Just as you'd ask a friend for help, you can and should turn to the Communion of Saints and ask for their prayers.

In today's Church, the canonization of saints is a formal three-stage process involving years of investigation, study and approval of evidence. In the way that we might hang family portraits in our homes, Catholics frequently keep images of the saints we love and respect to remind us of the lives they led and to inspire us along our own paths to sainthood.

We are blessed to have such wonderful examples of holy men and women who have gone before us and have lived lives of heroic virtue. Embracing intercessory relationships with them can help comfort us in times of spiritual need. We can also work to emulate their traits and virtues in our own lives by studying the way they lived and following their lead. If you haven't already done so, spend some time getting to know your patron saints and have a prayer relationship with them. By asking our saints to intercede on our behalf, by entrusting our children to their guidance and protection, and by attempting to live virtuously in our own little corners of the world, we will nurture our families and ourselves.

One Last Image of Emptiness: The Empty Tomb



This week, we conclude our exploration of emptiness in the Scriptures with the final – and most important – image of emptiness: Jesus' empty tomb.

No empty space is more full of life. No empty space holds more promise of abundant life for us, now and into eternity. Jesus' empty tomb is the foundation of all our hopes and the wellspring of our joy.

St. Paul goes so far as to say that all his preaching is empty if Christ has not risen from the dead. That is a bold claim. Either the tomb is empty or our faith is. There is no in between.

When addressing a controversy about whether or not there was a resurrection from the dead, Paul writes in I Corinthians 15:

"And if Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, your faith. Then we are also false witnesses to God, because we testified against God that he raised Christ, whom he did not raise if in fact the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, neither has Christ been raised, and if Christ has not been raised your faith is vain; you are still in your sins. Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all."

If the tomb is not empty, "we are the most pitiable people of all." Thanks be to God that Christ is risen indeed! If anything shows us that emptiness in God's economy is the most fitting place to pour out his abundance, it is Jesus' empty tomb. Lord, help us always to look at the empty places in our lives as the place from which you are able to bring new life!

Make Your IRA Charitable Rollover Gift

Did you know you can reduce your taxes by making a gift from your IRA directly to charity? If you are 70 1/2 years old or older, you can make a charitable gift up to \$108,000 directly from your IRA. This direct distribution can be made to a qualified charity such as your parish, a Catholic school, the Bishop's Appeal, a diocesan ministry, the Catholic Foundation, or another Catholic charity.



An IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) gift is an easy way to help fulfill our Church's mission and reduce your taxable income. Your gift may

qualify for your IRA required minimum distribution (RMD) which starts at the age of 73. Also, you will not have to pay federal income tax on the amount given directly from your IRA to a charity. QCDs made directly from your IRA are not subject to income tax and beneficial for those that cannot claim itemized deductions.

Here is how the QCD works:

- 1. You must be 70 1/2 years of age.
- 2. Your gift must come from an IRA (not a TSA or 401k).
- 3. Your gift is a **direct** transfer to a qualified charity such as St. Raphael Parish and the Catholic Foundation.
- 4. The maximum amount you can transfer is \$108,000. For a married couple filing jointly, each spouse may be able to make a gift for a potential of \$216,000.

To qualify as an IRA QCD or RMD, your gift must be made by December 31, 2025.

It is also important not to withdraw funds prior to making your gift. Instead, distribute the funds directly from your IRA to the qualified charity. If you would like your donation reflected on your year-end statement, please ask your Financial Advisor to include your name on the documentation.

We encourage families interested in making a QCD to speak with their financial advisor. For more information about how you can benefit from a QCD, please contact your IRA administrator and/or tax preparer. Please consider a QCD from your IRA to St. Raphael Parish, the Catholic Foundation, the Bishop's Appeal, or other Catholic charity. Make your gift as soon as possible to avoid any processing delays at the end of December, and don't miss the opportunity to make your IRA QCD this year! 
