

### Dear Parishioners.

IT IS ALMOST CHRISTMAS! I can hardly wait! But, let's not put the cart before the horse. It is still Advent after all...how do we prepare in these last days before Christmas?

In seminary, I was assigned the 4th Sunday in Advent of year A as a "practice homily." So, before I was a priest, I was to preach a "homily" on this Sunday's readings. You are in luck; it just so happens that I have a recording of that practice homily. Here are a few thoughts to consider from *Seminarian Ben circa November of 2020* (when I delivered my practice homily):

"Look to Joseph to prepare for Jesus." In order to prepare well for the coming of Jesus, our Gospel points us to the figure of Joseph. What does Joseph do? Well, he gets himself close to Mary. Joseph and Mary were, to use modern terms, an engaged couple. All of the engaged couples I know spend a lot of time together. He cares for Her well being, not being willing to expose Her to shame. And, at the appropriate time, Joseph takes Mary into his home. Essentially, they get married. In taking Mary into his home, Joseph is already welcoming Jesus into his life as He lives in Her womb. Amazing!

What a profound insight I had! In these last days before Christmas, while shopping for that Christmas ham and wrapping those gifts, draw near to Mary. Pray with Luke 1:26-56, offer the Rosary, or even just pray some *Hail Mary's*. As you do so, you will already be welcoming Jesus into your home.



# **Traditions Around the Manger**

Whether it is called a manger scene, crib, Nativity set, or creche, this is one of Advent and Christmas's most beloved traditions. I highly recommend getting unbreakable Mary, Joseph and Jesus figures so that your children can play with them. Manipulating the characters and acting out the Nativity story was a favorite activity for my children when they were young during Advent.

The Nativity has been portrayed in art down through the ages, but its popularity as a Christmas tradition began in Italy in 1223 when St. Francis reenacted what many believe was the first living Nativity scene at the monastery at Greccio. Villagers who came to watch that Christmas Eve were touched at the sight of a baby in a manger with an ox and donkey standing by. Churches in Italy began to erect nativity scenes each Christmas, and prominent families soon made their own, sometimes commissioning well-known sculptors to create the figures.

The custom soon spread to middle class and poor families as well, through Europe and then the world. In 1953, apparently worried the popularity of the Christmas tree would outshine the manger scene, a small, dedicated group called the European Crib Friends formed with the blessing of Pope Pius XII to propagate the tradition.

Bring out the Nativity scene at the beginning of Advent. It is a good way to focus your family on the real meaning of Christmas in the weeks to come. There are many traditions surrounding the creche, and you can also start your own. Here are a few ideas:

# Say evening prayer before the manger.

The novelty of the crib makes prayer time extra special, and children enjoy praying to the Baby Jesus.

### Practice waiting.

Consider starting with only the figures of Mary and Joseph placed at some distance from the manager. Move them a bit nearer each day of Advent, reflecting on their journey to Bethlehem. Add the remaining figures as the Christmas season progresses with the Wise Men finally arriving on Epiphany, January 6.

# **Ready for Christmas?!**

As I sit down to write, I find that I am not quite ready for Christmas. It's not so much that I have shopping yet to do or presents yet to wrap (although I still have plenty on my "to-do" list). It's that my heart and mind aren't ready just yet to start the celebrations. While Lent usually feels long to me, and I am ready for Easter, Advent rarely feels long enough. At least this year, we have a few days in the fourth week of Advent before Christmas arrives!

But Christmas is coming. For those of you picking up this bulletin on Christmas Eve or Day, it has already arrived. Are you ready - on the inside - for the celebration? There are a lot of reasons we could answer "no." Maybe you lost a loved one this year, and it feels hard to muster any joy this Christmas season. Maybe you are facing a challenging situation in your personal life or at work that makes it difficult to embrace the peace that the newborn Jesus brings. Maybe you have been disappointed in some way and the hope of a savior seems distant. Maybe a broken relationship is challenging your capacity to love. The possibilities for feeling unready go on.

The question to ask ourselves is this: Will we allow Jesus into our unreadiness? Will we let him come to us just as we are? Are we open to being surprised by his love?



If you aren't feeling ready for Christmas this season, spend a few moments with the infant Jesus and talk to him about why. Ask Mary if she will let you hold her newborn son, and ponder with her the difference he makes in our lives. It's his birthday, but he always desires to give us a gift. Faith, hope, joy, peace, love: what do you most need from him? Come, Lord Jesus; make us ready to receive you in our lives.






# Coming in January: Slow Down & Find **Rest in Jesus**


