

**THE HOLY FAMILY
OF JESUS, MARY & JOSEPH**





Dear Parishioners,

The Feast of the Holy Family is a beautiful feast in the Church's calendar (and one of my personal favorites), because it gives us an example of family life that really is attainable for all of us. While we might think the Holy Family had perfect days every day, the reality is far from that. Sure, Jesus is divine -- but he's also perfectly human, just like Mary and Joseph.


They were a typical Jewish family. When Jesus began to walk, you better believe that Mary "baby-proofed" the house and made sure that anything sharp in the kitchen was out of reach! As a typical toddler, Jesus would have heard his parents say "No! No! Don't touch that!!!" And as he approached his teen age years, Mary and Joseph worried about him when he was out of sight, just like any other good parents would. What made Mary and Joseph's home a holy one was that they were people of prayer and people of faith in the one true God of Israel. They didn't understand the Trinitarian nature of God early on, but they did know that God had entered a covenant with his people Israel. And faithful to living out that covenant, their home had a place for God at all times. The birth of Jesus solidified God's place in their home, but God was a part of daily life for Mary and Joseph even before that.

If we want to have holy families, even if we live individually, all we need to do is to live holy lives. Easier said than done, right? The thing is, it's easier than most people think. It does, however, take a conscious decision that only we can make individually. In today's second reading, Paul gives us the recipe for living in holiness. Specifically, he encourages particular behaviors when dealing with others. Paul instructs us to be compassionate, kind, humble, gentle, patient, tolerant and forgiving. All of those acts cost nothing but a conscious understanding.

He also encourages us to do all of these things in the name of Jesus. Of course, we can't do anything in the name of Jesus unless we know him and have a relationship with him thru prayer. The better the relationship with Jesus, the easier it is to live the attributes that Paul talks about because they all center themselves around love. And since God is Love and Jesus is God, it stands to reason that if we have a solid relationship with Jesus, then we have a solid relationship with love -- a love that allows us to become our very best and holy selves.

During this Christmas season, let's open our hearts to the love of Jesus, and through the example of Mary and Joseph center our lives around him. If we do this, then we'll become holy, and begin (or continue) to live in holy families!



On Sunday, December 27 we will celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. This year the Gospel is the flight of the Holy Family to Egypt (Matthew 2:13-15 19-23).

Is Your Family Perfect?

Even if you really, really like your family and it's a pretty functional family, no family is perfect. In fact, statistics say that almost 40% of families are mildly dysfunctional; 16% are moderately dysfunctional and 2% are severely dysfunctional. These are families where there is some type of dysfunction: abuse, neglect, violence, addiction, mental illness, constant conflict or misbehavior, which members of the family consider normal.

That's very sad because family is God's idea. God is the God of family. Family is how God chose to have each and every one of us come into the world. All of us, no matter what our situation, were born into a family.

So special is the family to God that He himself chose to come into the world as a little baby, born into a family. And so we have this Holy Family, the perfect family, some think. I don't think the Holy Family was perfect, because no family is. Did Mary and Joseph ever have disagreements? Sure. If they ever went grocery shopping together, I'm sure they had disagreements!

Imagine what it was like when they lost Jesus: Joseph: "I thought he was with you." Mary: "No, he was with you."

Did they have to deal with stress or crisis in their life? The first crisis began even before Jesus was born. So...was it perfect? Did Mary and Joseph not worry about their son? Don't you think Joseph had to tell Jesus to eat his vegetables? If Jesus had a sleepover didn't Joseph have to go into the kids' room at one in the morning to tell them to stop talking and go to sleep? I think the holy Family was as normal as families could be. And even if they weren't, at least for me, it's good to think that they were like my family. That way I have something to learn from them.

Let's make our families holy by practicing our faith. Practice respect for our elders: Children listen to the wisdom of your parents and grandparents. Put Christ at the center of your family story. Then our children, like the Christ child, will grow up in strength, filled with wisdom and the favor of God will be with them.

A New Year's Resolution to Slow Down

When I was growing up, the “oldies” station was always on in my family’s car. The soundtrack of my childhood was the music of the 1950s and 60s. I might not be able to tell you the name of the artist, but if I hear a song from that era, I can probably sing along. The song lyric that’s running through my mind today is Simon and Garfunkel: “Slow down, you move too fast...” It’s not my favorite song of theirs, but these words still come to mind when I find myself rushing from one thing to another.

The book we gave away at Christmas this year and our theme for adult faith formation in January is about slowing down and finding true rest in Jesus. I will confess that I am not very good at this. When I walk somewhere, I move at a pretty good clip. Driving the speed limit takes discipline. I am famous for trying to squeeze in “one more thing” before I get out the door. When I do slow down, it’s often because I am forced to, like when I get sick and my body will not keep going, or when a pandemic shuts down the world.

Our speaker and book discussion series in January is focused on this theme of slowing down and finding true rest in Jesus. We’re offering it partly at the inspiration of our Bishop, who has begun to encourage us to reclaim Sunday for worship and rest, and partly because our world is so rushed that I imagine I am not the only one who needs help slowing down. For our guest speakers and opportunity for discussion about the Christmas book, **Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy**, check out “**Coming in January**” in this bulletin.

In this column between now and Lent, I plan to offer some thoughts about what slowing down and being more aware of God’s invitation to rest and pay attention to him could look like in our lives. 




Coming in January: Slow Down & Find Rest in Jesus
