

The Epiphany: Come and Adore



We celebrate the feast of the Epiphany on January 4! This special day celebrates the coming of the Magi, the three wise men (or kings), from the East who followed a star and

came to adore Jesus. The definition of the word "epiphany" is a divine or supernatural manifestation, just as the wise men discovered Jesus.

"We Three Kings"

Who were the three kings? Their story is full of legend and tradition, but it is believed that they were skilled in watching the stars. They saw the bright star, and they knew that something special was about to happen, that the Messiah had finally arrived. The Magi traveled for a long time, roughly three years. Their first stop was to visit King Herod in Jerusalem because they thought that the King of the Jews would be born in a palace. Herod was furious because he did not know that Jesus' kingdom would be a heavenly one and he thought that his power was in danger. King Herod then met secretly with the Magi and asked them exactly when the star appeared. He told them that they could find the King of the Jews in Bethlehem.

"Westward Leading, Still Proceeding"

The Magi set out for Bethlehem and eventually they came to the house where Jesus, Mary and Joseph were staying. They gave Jesus the gifts they brought for Him, gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold because Jesus is king, frankincense because Jesus is God; and Myrrh because Jesus would one day die upon the cross to save us from our sins.

As they prepared to leave Bethlehem and return home, God warned them in a dream to avoid Herod and so they took a different way home. Herod was furious when he found out the Magi tricked him. Because he still felt threatened by this newborn king of the Jews, he ordered the killing of every baby boy from birth to three years old. God warned Joseph in a dream that they should flee to Egypt and so Joseph and Mary escaped to Egypt and Jesus' life was spared.

"We Traverse Afar"

There are many special ways all around the world to celebrate the Epiphany. In some countries, children open presents on the Epiphany instead of Christmas. Some people believe the Magi bring presents instead of Santa Claus. Christmas decorations can be taken down on the Epiphany.

"Guide Us to They Perfect Light"

The Epiphany should remind us of how special Jesus is and that we should spend our lives seeking Him. Jesus is the light for everyone and if we follow Him, we will never go astray.

Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy

Matthew Kelly in his book, *Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy*, challenges us to find a pace that allows us to live with joy. He points out that slowing down isn't our ultimate goal; a well-lived and abundant life is. But for most of us in our hurried and hectic culture, learning how to slow down is an important first step. When we constantly rush from one thing to the next, our vision gets blurry. We can't see what matters most anymore.

About halfway through his book, Kelly quotes Blaise Pascal, a French philosopher, mathematician, and inventor who lived in the 17th century. Pascal felt that "all of humanity's problems stem from man's inability to sit quietly in a room." Whether or not we agree with this statement, it's one that makes us think.

What would our world look like if we all took time to pause more often? What if we allowed ourselves time every day to sit quietly, even for a few minutes? We might start to remember that we are human beings, not human doings. Our value is not in our achievements or how much we accomplish each day. Rather, before we do a single thing, we are loved by and precious to God.

This "sitting quietly in a room" goes by another name for people of faith – prayer. It may seem, at times, like an emptiness, especially when we are so used to being busy. But it is an emptying out for a purpose. In prayer, we pause and cease our usual activity so that we can pay attention to the One who matters most, God. We learn to listen to him for our cues about what the right pace is for our lives – and so much more.

Whether you are a beginner to prayer or have been praying for a long time, I encourage us all this month to pause more often. Be still for a few minutes and do nothing but the most important thing. Spend an intentional moment with God. Remember that you are God's beloved son or daughter. Think about how at that very moment (and every moment) God is looking upon you with love. Then repeat as often as you can!

Let us remain together always in God's loving gaze!






Coming in January: Slow Down & Find Rest in Jesus

Marriage Information



Getting Married?

Congratulations! We would like to help prepare you for the Sacrament of Matrimony. Please call the parish office at least six months prior to your desired wedding date to begin preparation. Marriage preparation prepares you and your future spouse to live a sacramental marriage that is free, faithful, permanent, and fruitful. The grace of God gives strength to live out the sacrament.

Already married but not married in the Church?

You may call to meet with one of our priests to discuss the possibility of entering into the Sacrament of Matrimony in addition to your civil marriage. This would be a new step in your relationship, asking the grace of God to be at work, and binding you and your spouse to vows before God.

Previously married?

If you have been married and divorced, you may want to discuss the possibility of an annulment. An annulment process looks at whether the prior marriage had conditions missing for it to be a sacramental marriage. The annulment process is concerned mainly with the personal and spiritual aspects of marriage. It does not "erase" the civil contract, and it does not render children illegitimate. It merely states that after thorough investigation, the Church has decided that a marriage, as the Church understands marriage, was not valid. Deacon John Ingala and Fr. Tom from our parish are trained to assist people in this process. Please call the parish office to set up a time to discuss this with one of them. If an annulment is granted, the person is then free to enter into a sacramental marriage.

Infant Baptism

Infants accept the faith through the faith of their parents. Our parish offers group sessions to prepare parents for the baptism ceremony and for leading their children in a life of faith. Sessions are held twice per month, all year round. It may be easier to participate in a session before the child is born. Please call or email to register for the Baptism Preparation session and to schedule your child's baptism.

Contact Jill Eaton at 920-233-8044, ext 222 jill.eaton@raphael.org. There is one session for the first child, and a different session for the second child. Once parents have completed both sessions, they do not need to repeat for subsequent children.

One **Catholic godparent** is needed, who must be a **Confirmed, practicing Catholic** at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, there should be **one male and one female**. There should not be more than two godparents. A non-Catholic Christian may serve as a Christian witness in addition to the Catholic godparent.
