

Dear Parishioners,

I never get tired of Baptizing people. It is one of the great joys of my priesthood! This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord - the fact that our savior Himself was baptized. It seems a little bit strange when you think about it. Jesus is God. He never sinned. He is the one who SAVES us from sin...

Even John the Baptist noticed this reality. He said to Jesus, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" But Jesus's response gives insight into why He was baptized. "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." *To fulfill all righteousness Jesus entered into profound solidarity with His People. He took on all that we go through. He came as the true man. So, even though He never sinned and had no need to be cleansed, in great humility He united himself to sinners (cf. Philippians 2:5-11).*

Jesus united himself to our sinful humanity so closely that we might be united to Him perfectly. He came as a man and was baptized so that we might be transformed into images of the Only Begotten


Son of the Father through Baptism. What a grace that is? No wonder I never tire of baptizing people!

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Heavenly Hero for January: St. Francis De Sales



Born: 1567 in France

Died: 1622

Feast Day: January 24

Patronage: writers, journalists, and the deaf

Francis, the eldest of 13 children, was born into a family of nobility in France in 1567. His father sent him to study at the University of Paris. Francis' intelligence amazed his professors and he was also a skilled swordsman, horseman, and dancer. His father wanted him to marry, but Francis desired to be a priest. and Francis was ordained to the priesthood in 1593.

Francis and his cousin Louis, who was also a priest, volunteered to work in Chablais, where religious conflicts were taking place between Catholics and Protestants. These conflicts often resulted in violence. Francis tried to win hearts with words rather than anger or force because he stated, *"you can get more flies with honey than you can get with vinegar."* *He began to distribute weekly essays and preached with power and charm in simple, clear language. His gentleness and love drew many hearts to God.*

After being named the bishop of Geneva, Francis not only encouraged new priests but he also trained laypeople to teach catechism. Francis gave spiritual guidance to all people. He wrote a book called The Introduction to the Devout Life. It shows that everyone can grow in holiness. In addition to being a gifted writer, preacher, and spiritual director, Francis helped Jane Frances de Chantal found the Visitation convent of nuns.

Francis died on December 28, 1622, in Lyon, France. He was canonized in 1665 and named a Doctor of the Church in 1877. He is the patron of writers and journalists.

Talking Point with Children: Francis was blessed with great intelligence and wealth. He used these gifts to bring other people closer to Christ through his words and actions. Today people communicate mostly through social media, but just like Francis used the printed word to bring others closer to Jesus, our social media presence can reflect our faith in Christ.

Action Step for Children: This week, look for an opportunity to share your faith with someone else in a positive and joyful way.



Understanding the Sacraments God's Grace Guaranteed!

I recently attended a Women of Christ Conference in Waukesha where I met Fr. Chris Alar who is the Provincial Superior of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of Mercy Province of the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception in the United States and Argentina. He is the host of the EWTN show *Living Divine Mercy*.

He is an author and has written a series called Explaining the Faith. The book that caught my attention was Understanding the Sacraments. During our conversation he asked what I did for a living and I said that I work at a parish and part of my job is to work with kids age 7-17 who are in need of Sacraments. He told me that I should read his book on understanding the Sacraments and then use what I have learned to teach the kids. So, I did just that!

I have decided to write a series over the next month or so to pass on to you the things that I have learned. As St. Thomas Aquinas taught, "You cannot love what you do not know," I hope you will come to love your Catholic faith more deeply and if you have already learned about the Sacraments, this will be a good review and hopefully a source of some new information!

Guaranteed Grace

The reason the Sacraments are so important is that the Holy Spirit acts through them. They are not just symbols of grace; they are actual grace itself! The Sacraments give us guaranteed grace and eternal life if we cooperate with this grace. The Holy Spirit gives us the Church, and the Church in return gives us the Sacraments.

The Sacraments are connected to ultimately form you into a disciple of Christ. Your spiritual life begins at Baptism. It is matured at Confirmation. Your soul is renewed at Reconciliation after you fall into sin. Your spirit and perhaps, your body are healed with the Anointing of the Sick. Families are made with Marriage. The Church is sustained through Holy Orders by giving us priests to give us the Sacraments. And your soul is fed and sustained throughout this whole process because Christ is present in the Eucharist that you receive at Holy Communion.



The Sacraments are what Christ did on Earth for our salvation. God commanded us in the Bible to receive all seven Sacraments.

Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy

In the book, *In His Spirit*, Fr. Dick Hauser talks about the two main reasons people find it challenging to pray. The main difficulty comes from having the wrong focus. When we are focused on our own selfish interests and are self-centered, it is hard to center ourselves on God in prayer. This is especially true when we are complacently absorbed by some kind of sinful pattern in our lives. Our selfishness blocks us from being in good relationship with God, just like it is a barrier to good relationships with other people.

The second difficulty that Fr. Hauser points out is one that fits our January theme of “slowing down to the speed of joy.” He writes: “The second reason we have difficulty praying is that we are unable to quiet down enough to become sensitive to the movements of the [Holy] Spirit. This usually happens because we have been living our lives at too fast a pace. Rushing from one activity to the next, we lose touch with the Spirit. We are not moving against the Spirit in a sinful way, but we are not allowing the Spirit to infuse our activities, enabling us to perform them in peace and joy.” He comments that when we anxiously rush around in our lives, we shouldn’t be surprised that we feel restless when we come to prayer.

Sometimes our rushed pace of life means that we literally can’t sit still long enough to pray. Sometimes we can force ourselves to stop physically, but our minds are still rushing at a 1,000 miles an hour, one thought after another racing by. When I get into this mode, I find my prayer turns into rumination, thinking endlessly about things, but not actually sharing them with God and letting him have an opportunity to respond. What do you notice happening in yourself when the pace you are keeping is too fast for you? What signals do your body and soul give you that you need to slow down?

Last week, I recommended pausing periodically throughout the day to remember how God is looking upon you with love, pondering how he delights in you as his beloved son or daughter. Have you tried this? If not, could you start this week? If you have been doing this, have you noticed a difference? Could you extend one of these brief pauses to five minutes to look back over your day, thanking God for his gifts to you that day and asking for his help with some challenge you are facing?



Let's keep seeking that pace of life that allows us to live in tune with God and know his peace and joy.







Contact Jill Eaton at 920-233-8044, ext 222 jill.eaton@raphael.org. There is one session for the first child, and a different session for the second child. Once parents have completed both sessions, they do not need to repeat for subsequent children.

One **Catholic godparent** is needed, who must be a **Confirmed, practicing Catholic** at least 16 years of age. If there are two godparents, there should be **one male and one female**. There should not be more than two godparents. A non-Catholic Christian may serve as a Christian witness in addition to the Catholic godparent.
